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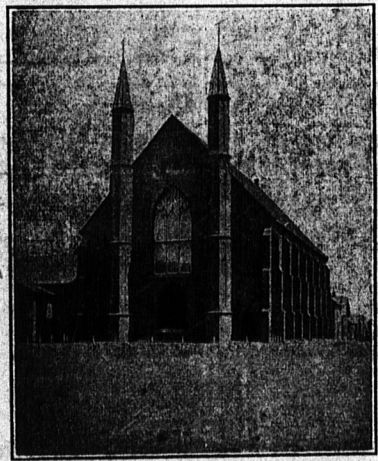
GREAT ITALIAN VICTORY ON GORIZIA FRONT

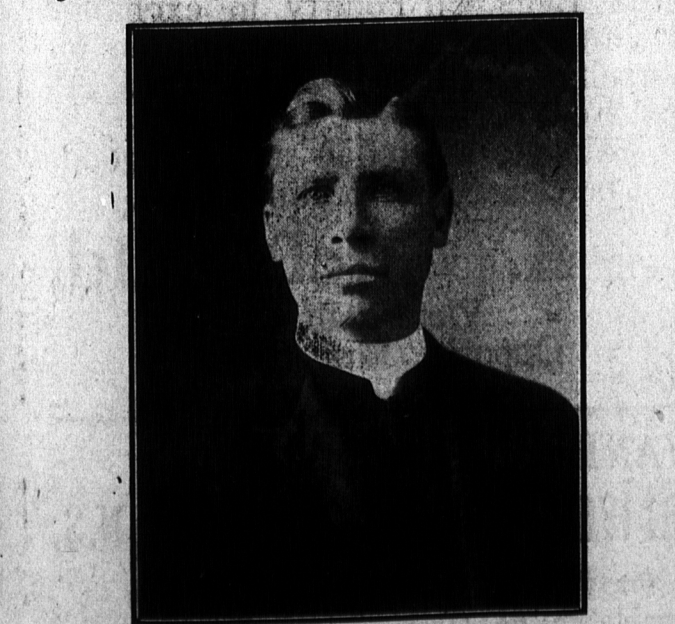
FIRST METHODIST CHURCH TO RE-OPEN SUNDAY, NOV. 12

STILL VIOLENTLY FIGHTING ON ROUMANIAN FRONT

Success and Defeat Alternate in Different Sectors. Roumanians Have Driven Off Austro-German Attacks in Buzeu Valley. Austro-Germans Extended Their Gains at Another Point Taking Prisoners.

(Canadian Press Despatch) LONDON, Nov. 3.—Violent fighting continues to mark the Austro-German attempts to penetrate the plains of Roumania, south of Kronstadt and Hermannstadt towards Bicharest.

(The Roumanians advancing in Buzeu Valley have driven the invaders back over the frontier in the region of Table Butzia. They also have taken Mount Sirul Taturumio, along the Transylvanian border southeast of Kronstadt, south of Permannstadt.

Plot to Blow Up N. Y. Subway Station

1,820 SHIPS HAVE BEEN DESTROYED SINCE WAR BEGAN.

(Canadian Press Despatch) NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—One thousand eight hundred and twenty ships, with an aggregate gross tonnage of approximately 3,328,584 have been sunk by belligerent nations during twenty-seven months of war ending November 1, according to figures compiled from cable despatches and mail advices published here today by the Journal of Commerce.

THE GREEK CRISIS HAS COME TO A HEAD

Royalists and Venizelos Parties Have Come to Blows. Allied Troops Still Patrol Streets of Athens Pending Complete Agreement with Constantine.

(LONDON, November 2.—Civil war has broken out in Greece. The conflict between Venizelos and King Constantine, that has been brewing ever since Bulgaria joined the Teutonic allies, has become an armed struggle.

The important factor in the whole situation is the size of the force Venizelos has been able to muster. A fort-announcement that Katrina has been evacuated. The monarch is rallying around him all the forces he can muster, for the rebels apparently are determined to seize the railway to Athens.

The rebel forces found comparatively few troops opposed to them. This was due to another demand of King Constantine's army was curtailed recently in response to the demands of the allies.

British Capture German Prize Crew And Steamer

LONDON, Nov. 3.—An Admiralty official statement issued tonight tells of the recapture from the Germans of the Dutch steamer Oldambt. It says: "The Dutch steamer Oldambt was captured by the enemy Wednesday night near Nord Hinder Lightship. A prize crew aboard the ship was being taken to Zeerbrugge, when about daylight some of our light scouting craft overtook her.

Washington Discovers Marina Carried 4.7 gun. Germans justified in Sinking Her.

(Canadian Press Despatch) WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—Secretary Lansing made a statement during the day explaining that the State Department understood that Germany's pledges not to sink merchant ships without proper provision for the safety of persons on board applied to merchantmen armed for defense as well as to unarmed vessels.

"STRICT ACCOUNTABILITY" DANGER IS OVER

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 2, via London.—A German submarine placed a prize aboard the Dutch steamer Oldambt, which left the Hook of Holland yesterday. At six o'clock this morning a British destroyer appeared and recaptured the Oldambt, according to the Het Volk. The prize fired two bombs, with the hope of destroying their prize, but the Oldambt remained afloat.
