BAD NEWS FROM AFRICA.

Yesterday afternoon tidings from South Africa was of a distinctly depressing character. As it comes from Lord Roberts himself direct there can be no doubt of its accuracy. Again by surprise and an attack in force, this time apparently quite near Pretoria, the enemy has captured a British position, making prisoners of a squadron of Scotch Greys, and five companies of the Lincolnshire Regiment, and securing six guns of the Royal Artillery as trophies of their victory.

This is as regrettable as it is surprising. It shows that the enemy is still in strong force in the Transvaal, still resourceful and enterprising, determined to continue the war and apparently capable of prolonging the struggle for an indefinite time in the future. It had been thought that only a guerilla warfare could be carried on by the reduced forces of the enemy. Apparently the time has not yet come when British troops can be spared from South Africa to be taken to China, where they are so greatly needed just now.
