ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

CITY COURT meets today. There are about fifty cases on the docket.

REV. Professor C. F. Chedzill, M. A. delivered an interesting address in Grace Church last night.

PLOT holders are reminded of the annual meeting of Sherwood Cemetery this afternoon at 4 o'clock in the Y.M.C.A. building.

MANY in Charlottetown and other parts of the province will hear with great regret of the death of Capt. William H. Bernard of the late ill-fated Marion Louise yesterday in Cambridge, Mass., while en route home.

The Guardian adds its congratulations to John McKay, harness maker, on the presentation to him by a number of his friends on Monday of an address and a handsome rattan chair on the 25th anniversary of his business career in Summer side.

In the number and status of the very large audience at the First Methodist Choir concert last evening in the Opera House, the hearty applause, and the merits of the entertainment there was nothing to be desired. The tableaux were superb, the musical numbers admirably executed and Miss Jarley's Wax Works most amusing. "The best concert of the season" was the general verdict.

The Stanley made the round trip from Georgetown yesterday and the special came to the city at 7.10 returning at 8.45. The Minto left Pictou at 7 for Charlottetown and by eleven o'clock had reached a point about five miles outside the Blockhouse. The mails and passengers were brought to the city by team at half past five. The mails were sent last night via Georgetown. The Minto will endeavor to break in today.

The sad news was received here by telegram to J. Frank McMillan, Manager of the Merchants Bank of P. E. Island, yesterday morning of the death of Captain W. H. Bernard, at North Cambridge, Mass. There were no particulars. Only two days previously Mr. McMillan had received a letter from the captain who was at the time of writing in good health, and the news of his death came as a sudden surprise and shock to citizens. Captain Bernard was for many years one of Summerside's foremost citizens and most highly respected.

CH'TOWN FARMERS' MARKET.

A fairly large assembly of farmers attended market yesterday but supplies were not so plentiful as on Easter Saturday.

Dressed hogs were not offering in such large quantities as heretofore, and buyers were not anxious to advance prices over 6cts for best quality, and 5c for light weights. Live hogs (best bacon) at the Dominion Packing yards are still quoted at 5cts per lb. and other grades lower figures.

The demand and supply of hay is about balanced and prices are the same as those quoted last week, from 60 to 70cts per 100 lbs according to quality.

Oats (black) brought 35cts per bushel, and white 34cts per bushel. The slight advance of prices is brought about by the competition of street buyers which however is not a true indication that the market is firm.

Potatoes are bringing about 33cts per bushel, with slightly higher figures given for some loads to go in schooners new loading.

Eggs have a downward tendency and will certainly drop still lower in a few days. 14c per doz. was the price paid yesterday. The local trade price is usually 1c higher.

Butter remains firm with dairy prices from market baskets at 23 to 24c per lb. and 19c to 19c per lb.

Fowl brought 8 to 9c per lb. Some best carcasses were offering, but the demand after the large Easter supply was not active, from 5c to 6c per lb being paid.
