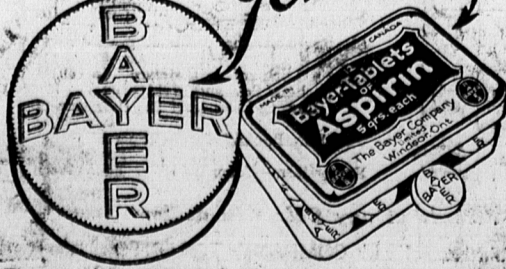

Says Peace Of Europe Involved

PARIS, July 18.—Germany's attitude on the reparations question has brought into question the entire peace of Europe, says Le Temps. It demands that the French government inform the British government that France can pay nothing on her war debts, either interest or principal, so long as the French treasury has not received the equivalent amounts due her for reparations.

British Position

LONDON, July 18.—Answering a question in the House of Commons, Prime Minister Lloyd George said a communication had been addressed by the German government to the Reparations Commission and that the text would be circulated in the official report to be issued by Mr. Lloyd George said it would be necessary for the British and other governments to consider seriously the matter and to consult each other and the Reparations Commission concerning it.

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., July 18.—Two persons believed to be Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Johnson, of St. Paul, were found shot to death in an automobile near Minneapolis today, and police are investigating to ascertain whether they had been murdered or if it was a case of murder and suicide.
