Mr. Macdonald speaks in the highest terms of the Kentucky people, their hospitality and courteous kindness, but has retained for twenty-eight years that he has been absent a strong love for his old Irish home and is still a loyal British subject.

David Henderson, Acton, Ont., M. P. for Halton, is registered at the Queen Hotel, City, and is making a tour of the Maritime Provinces. This is his first visit to Prince Edward Island, and he expressed himself as much pleased with what he has so far seen of this Province and Eastern Canada. Mr. Henderson is a Conservative and a Presbyterian and has been elected as representative for Halton in the House of Commons on seven different occasions.
