ROOSEVELT CREW GIVING TROUBLE

Want The Roosevelt Put in Dry Dock—Men Complain of Food And Bad Usage . . . Famous Explorer Detained at Sydney in Consequence.

SYDNEY, N. S., Nov. 27.—Commander Peary was unable to leave Sydney Monday morning owing to a number of objections, but chiefly on account of the objection of his crew to any further sea-going in such a battered craft as the Roosevelt, which they insisted should be put into a dry dock for repairs.

There is no dock in Sydney to accommodate the Roosevelt. Divers will examine her hull.

Captain Bartlett has had much trouble with the crew, and declares they must leave the Roosevelt. He has sent to his home for a new crew.

Some of the crew hung from the main rigging portions of the meat served them to "show folks a share the kind of stuff fed to the men."

Officers ordered the meat cut down. The correspondents at the invitation of the officers of the Roosevelt ate some of the walrus and pemican served on the ship.

WALRUS TASTES LIKE MUTTON.

Both were first class, the walrus meat tasting like mutton. The pemican made a splendid lean dried beef, and mixed with beef suet, sugar and currants tastes better than plum duff. The coffee, while old, was palatable, and the biscuits could not be excelled.

The men in the fore-cabin are a careless set, not over good as sailors. For all that the command had great trouble with them, they have been well treated and got good, wholesome food.

For breakfast they got boiled rice, bread, butter and tea. After boiling huge portions of each they complained that they should have had more.

SOME REAL OLD TOBACCO

In addition to the ill-effects which belonged to the English expedition sent out under Hall, which Peary found at Black-iff Bay, the Roosevelt brought back two cases of plug tobacco from the Greely expedition. It is in perfect condition, after twenty-five years at Fort Cooper. The lifeboat was found in latitude 82 degrees 20 minutes, in the "tween decks of the ship. It was in good shape.

Eight children were born to Eskimo mothers on the trip North. This exceeds by five the former birth record. Dr. Wolff, the physician to the expedition, has, he says, discovered in the Eskimo women traces of European ancestry. He found that the Eskimo woman has the narrow waist of her Canadian sister.

The theory of Dr. Wolff strengthens the belief of Peary that the native North Americans came to this continent from Siberia by way of the ice bridge abutments of the North Pole.

ESKIMO COUPLE WEDDED

On the voyage Charles Clarke, fireman on the Roosevelt, married an Eskimo couple. He read the marriage service of the Episcopal church. The wedding ring was made of reindeer skin. The bride was fourteen and the groom thirty.

Peary made the Eskimos promise that they would no longer indulge in the custom of exchanging wives. The custom has been to arrange a wrestling match for another man's wife, the victor getting the woman.

Fireman Clark still has a piece of the walrus hide which he ate when lost with Fireman Ryan in North Greenland. He ate also his birdskin shirt and part of his skin boots. Dog meat tasted to him like rabbit, he says. Clarke says that he was resigned to death when Peary rescued him. Ryan dined on his fur coat.

ADVENTURES OF SHIPWRECKED CREW

LONDON, Eng., Nov. 27.—Remarkable adventures that befel the crew of the Glasgow steamer Dorabrook are recounted in a letter received at Shields from third engineer Smith. The vessel's account of the recent typhoon off Daughin Island, Mobile, and after drifting all night, the men camped on the beach and at night fires were lit to keep away wild animals abounding in the island. The crew, who regularly attended the village church four miles away, had to be armed with guns to protect themselves against the attacks of wild pigs. Seven days were occupied in aligning channels leading to the sea before the Dorabrook was floated.
