ACCIDENT DUE TO PILOT'S MISTAKE

MONTREAL, May 6.—Because it is
alleged the pilot of the Saturnia
mistook for the "Pillars" the
Lower Traverse last Tuesday, the
Donaldson boat bumped the rock and
punctured two of her ballast tanks.
That was the reason for the accident
given yesterday in the Wreck
Commissioners' Court.

Captain Taylor gave the explanation
of the accident given him by
the pilot in charge at the time, Jules
Lachance. Captain Taylor was
sleeping when the ship struck. He
had had only three hours sleep in
the preceding forty-eight hours while
before that time he had been up on
the bridge most of the time during
which he had been in the ice zone.
Two feet more away, he said, would
have cleared the rock. He blamed
the accident upon the failure of the
pilot to distinguish the "Pillars"
and the absence of all buoys and the
lights from the Traverse.

"The channel is not fit for any
ship to come up until it is properly
marked after a winter like you have
here in Canada, carrying down every-
thing into the channel," was his re-
ply to a question regarding early
season navigation on the river.
