APPLE CROP WILL BEAT ALL RECORDS

So Says General Traffic Manager Fraser of the D. A. R.

HALIFAX, Sept. 18.—William Fraser, general traffic manager of the Dominion Atlantic Railway, arrived in this city last evening and will spend a few days visiting points of interest in the island.

The D. A. R. is particularly busy just now in looking after the transportation of the apple crop. Mr. Fraser says that Nova Scotia will have a bumper crop of apples this year, beating all previous records. The yield is estimated at half a million barrels and is said to be in splendid condition.

SENDING OUT THE RURAL MAIL BOXES

OTTAWA, Sept. 18.—The Postoffice Department is already at work giving effect to the announcement of Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux at Niagara Falls on Tuesday promising that free rural mail delivery would be promptly established throughout Canada.

Applications for the installation of mail boxes along the main routes are now pouring in at a great rate, and the department is hard at work sending out the boxes as fast as the applications come in. It will necessarily take some time before all the rural mail routes can be supplied with the boxes, but this will be done just as rapidly as possible.

MAN DRAGGED BY FRIGHTENED W

TORONTO, Sept. 18.—Fred Hannah met with a painful accident which rendered him unconscious for a time. Mr. Hannah was driving his cow around his wrist. The cow suddenly started to fright and pulled Mr. Hannah violently to the ground. The animal started off on a fast run and the unfortunate man was dragged for some distance. He was roughly shaken up and badly bruised. When discovered, the injured man was in an unconscious condition.

COMMISSION ON WOOLEN INDUSTRY

MONTREAL, Sept. 18.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier, addressing the Canadian Manufacturers Association as good as promised that a commission would look into the grievances of the woolen manufacturers. President R. Hoopson, of Hamilton, occupied the chair and in proposing the health of Canada, proceeded to reiterate the serious conditions of the press. He contended that in order to secure political capital certain newspapers had endeavored to put the farmers against the manufacturers of the Dominion.

Proceeding, he declared that Canadian manufacturers had built up a home market, which would not have been secured in any other way. "Take away," he said, from the farmer the towns and cities built up by a protective tariff, and the farmers best markets will be lost. He proceeded to allege that the woolen industry had declined for want of adequate protection. He contended that the Association owes no allegiance to any party, but strives for the good of the Country as a whole. Turning to Sir Wilfrid Laurier the chairman said, "I am authorized to state to you that this Association will welcome a tariff commission to look into this question and report to Parliament."
