PAY OF ATTENDANTS AT FALCONWOOD.

We received some time ago a long letter signed Farmer setting forth that the pay of the attendants at Falconwood is entirely inadequate and ought to be increased.

The public might be surprised to learn that the attendants and other subordinate employees engaged in Falconwood Asylum receive less than a dollar a day, few of them receiving any more than sixty-six cents a day.

Many people pay considerable amounts of money for the safe keeping and care of friends who have been stricken with that worst of all afflictions, the loss of reason, and no doubt expect their patients to be cared for better than they could be at home.

Now how can this be expected when those entrusted with that care are paid less than decent living wages? There can be only one result, general dissatisfaction, which must lead to constant changes, and the consequent employment of unskilled persons.

The Government have employed an expert resident physician to devote his whole time to the institution, but while taking this step in the right direction why should they neglect those employees who, though in

subordinate positions are nevertheless charged with responsibilities out of all proportion to the remuneration given?

"I am one of those who are interested in the welfare of friends at the hands of those employees and feel very keenly on this matter which has been repeatedly called to my attention. I fear that many of those charged with the support of patients have little idea of the risk they are running in placing their friends in the hands of underpaid, and therefore what must necessarily be unskilled attendants."

Such are the essential features of the letter before us. We respectfully direct the attention of the Government thereto, believing that what can be done will be done to remedy the conditions which Farmer has set forth. He seems to have stated the case of the attendants and employees with commendable moderation.

MENNONITES AND DOUKHOBORS.

Among the settlers who have come to western Canada from Continental Europe and which have attracted marked attention from time to time are the Mennonites and the Doukhobors. The Mennonites came in 1874 and 1876 to the number of some 6,500 and settled in Manitoba, west of the Red River. This was in the days of Mackenzie Government. They have made excellent settlers and have greatly modified the rigorous ascetic traditions to which they first adhered. The leading tenets of the Mennonites were baptism on profession of faith after the manner of the Baptists, refusal of oaths, of civil office and refusal to bear arms or support warfare. In these particulars their creed had something in common with the Doukhobors. The Doukhobors came something over 2,000 strong early in 1899 and were followed in the same year by about as many more. Their hope that most of these, though less tractable and acceptable than the Mennonites will in time wholly conform to the customs of the country and make good citizens. The class that go on naked pilgrimages and make trouble seem to be but a fraction of the whole body now numbering some 4,500.

Steady and quite rapid progress is being made with the flying machine, and every few days some record is broken. Count Zeppelin has just made a notable flight in his steerable balloon over Switzerland, sailing a distance of 408 miles in twelve hours at a railway speed of 31 miles an hour. In the meantime the flying machine proper, which had no support but its own wings and motive power, is daily extending its flight. At least a dozen inventors are working along this line. Prof. Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone, predicts that in the years to come flying machines will be as common as telephones are now. Who can tell?

A number of the church courts of various religious bodies in Charlottetown at their annual meetings have condemned the three-fifths clause of the local option law, but the Anglican Synod of Toronto on motion of S. H. Blake, K. C. seconded by Canon Talbot, endorsed it.

The Grand Jury in their brief presentation find the Hospital for the insane clean and well-conducted, with no improvements to suggest. The hope for a new Jail and a new Poor House, but found things as good as could be expected or is possible in the former, and the inmates, clean and comfortable as could be expected in the latter. This is satisfactory so far.

Forward, the official organ of the Sons of Temperance in Nova Scotia tells that in the month of June just closed "a member of the Legislature of Nova Scotia and an Indian, kindred spirits, together quaffed the flowing bowl and both bit the dust at the feet of King Alcohol." In plain words, they got drunk, were sent to jail, and there, when they had sobered up, the lawmaker paid both fees.

Massachusetts permits and encourages automobiles while Prince Edward Island discourages them. An official record tells that in the year past sixty-two persons were killed in the Bay State by automobiles. There were also 640 injured. Of the killed 21 were in the machine, and forty-one were not, while of the injured 240 were drivers or passengers and 400 were not. The record is somewhat appalling.
