This score pretty well represents the play, but by no means the hilarity and fun enjoyed by the record crowd in attendance. Some surprisingly smart plays were pulled off by these gay old has-beens in the field and a lot of good solid hitting was displayed.

Only in the base-running department did the boys betray that their athletic glory was as the glory of Greece and Rome, now departed. French Boxer Defeats Greco In Exhibition

MONTREAL, Aug. 3—(CP)—France's Laurent Dauthuille disposed of Montreal's jolting Johnny Greco in short order tonight when he knocked out the Canadian welterweight champion in the fifth round of a non-title, 10-round boxing match at the rain-drenched Montreal Baseball Stadium.

A near-capacity crowd sat through nearly an hour's heavy rain in the biggest open air fight event of the local season to see Greco, weighing 153 1/2 meet Dauthuille 155 1/2.

Dauthuille held the edge all the way and Greco attempting to step up into the middleweight class, couldn't seem to get going.

Both fighters had trouble getting their Sunday punches going on the wet canvas.

The K. O. came with startling suddenness at the 257 mark of the fifth. Greco had been bullying in, unable to get past Dauthuille's upright stance. Dauthuille went on the attack and hurt Greco with a swift and hammering series of blows. A left hook straightened up Greco, then a right cross finished him. Greco slipped to the canvas, sat there dazed for several seconds, then with a sigh collapsed on his back and was counted out.

An unofficial estimate placed the crowd at 19,000—an outstanding crowd considering the rainy weather. Although there had been intermittent showers all day, promoter Raoul Godbout decided against calling the card off.

When the main event went on, the rain was gone but the ring was exceptionally slippery.

Sees N. S. Baseball Condition Unhealthy

TRURO, N.S., Aug. 3—(CP)—Concern over the future of senior baseball in Nova Scotia was expressed by President Clyde Nunn of the Nova Scotia Amateur Baseball Association.

Following a meeting of the N.S. A.B.A. here, Mr. Nunn said senior baseball was in an "unhealthy" condition due to a "host of mediocre ball players drawing salaries far over their heads" causing the "subsequent or approaching bankruptcy of a number of leading ball clubs."

Reorganization of the Nova Scotia baseball set-up with "regulations compatible to present day conditions or the outright adoption of semi-pro status" was recommended.
