Annual Meeting Red Cross Society

The following reports were read at the annual meeting of the P. E. I. Division of the Canadian Red Cross on Monday.

JUNIOR RED CROSS REPORT

In spite of the fact that the Red Cross as a whole now has its thought and its energies turned largely towards its war time duties, the Junior Red Cross in the schools continues to stress kindly attitudes to others, physical fitness for the members and necessary treatment for the children who have been handicapped by disease or by accident and whose claim on the Red Cross is no less than if they had been injured in battle.

Organization and Publicity

Continuous contact is maintained with all Junior Branches by the issuing of the monthly news letter which is sent out with the monthly magazine "The Canadian Red Cross Junior." Many branches are so busy on a voluminous correspondence with the Red Cross Office, Miss Darrach, was able to visit in the autumn 206 schools with 41 departments where she addressed 241 groups of children. Addresses were given at the Provincial Teachers' Conventions in the spring and at the Provincial Exhibition. An address was given to the Teachers in training.

Branch Activities

Annual reports sent in by branches would indicate that interest is being well maintained in all the peace-time objectives of the Junior Red Cross, although many branches have also undertaken war activities such as hemming bandages, knitting scarfs, sweaters, wristlets or making special contributions to the Soldiers' Fund.
