THE RESULT OF SIN IS SELF-HURT

(Continued from page 1.) way we work out our own Salvation. This is the appeal to self-interest. It is, not, of course, the highest ground of moral appeal. The appeal must always, in the first instance, be made to the altruistic and unselfish. Nevertheless our Lord admits this question of human cupidity. When the disciples, after witnessing the failure of the rich young ruler to enter into that large spirit of sacrifice and self-denial, asked the Master what they should have as the reward of their loyalty and service, did He not promise them thrones and a hundred-fold return for what they had given up for the cause of truth? Are we not plainly told that Godliness is profitable unto all things? Is a man to be condemned because he asks the questions, "Will it pay?" We reply, emphatically, "Yes, it will pay." Even in this matter of spiritual commerce, the investment returns a hundredfold dividend. Self-interest becomes, therefore, a legitimate consideration. I can make my appeal to the sinner on the ground that his happiness, his intrinsic value as a man, his worth as a citizen, are all enhanced and glorified by his loyalty to God's will. I am glad that the appeal of nobility and gratitude; the longing for truth and reality; the splendor and sublimity of holiness will draw men to Christ. But so great are the interests and possibilities of the spiritual life, I am also glad that this warning signal of self-interest and self-hurt is displayed. The great consideration, after all, is that we shall find in the peace of Christ and relate ourselves harmoniously to the beneficent laws of His kingdom. The doctrine of this text is the on-

ly philosophy of personal responsibility. We are not to hide behind some infelicity of ancestry or circumstance; we are not to blame the Almighty or His law, or our fellow beings in organized society. We are not to be cowards in this business of sin's penalty. We are not to extenuate and excuse ourselves. And it is gross stupidity and futility to attempt to cheat and deceive ourselves in this fundamental law of conduct. Sin and punishment are self-imposed. It is well, finally, for us to distinguish between punishment and chastisement. These are two very different aspects of suffering. The one is a penalty, the other is a providence. Our punishment has to do with this automatic relationship, between the sinner and his sin. In his sense God never punishes. The question will arise as to the misfortune of the righteous. The righteous most assuredly have experiences for seeming disaster and suffering. But God is a Father as well as a moral governor. "Whom the Lord loveth He chasteneth." The discipline of life is the mark of sonship and not to be understood as the punishment of sin. Sin's folly should be reiterated over and over, lest we forget and enter the fool's paradise. Sin will always devalue and damage and destroy. No halcyon day of the future will abrogate or abrogate the stern necessity of sin's havoc. No future discovery will reverse the multiplication table or the law of gravitation. No sophistry can obscure or revoke sin's stern decrees. What, therefore, shall we say of him who is the deliberate victim of his own folly? From the far-gone centuries of the past men have been told that "He that sinneth against me, wrongeth his own soul." Nay more, this tragic law, written in our very members, tears away the fancied romance of sin, and tells the sinner that he is a fool. "Fools make a mock of sin."

THREE GIRLS BEAT TEACHER.

The eldest Miss Eldridge replied in a way that caused Mrs. Hall to slap her in the face. Then the fight was on between the girls and the teacher. The girls came from fighting Kentucky stock, and are large and powerful for their age. The teacher, fighting against great odds, was soon on the floor. One of the misses had obtained a half "Nelson" hold and was pinning the screaming schoolmarm in all parts of the body. 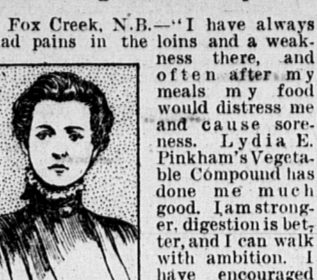
