Kirkland Lake Death Toll Three

KIRKLAND LAKE, Ont., Oct. 30.—(CP)—Death toll in yesterday's Lake Shore gold mine rockblasts reached three today with the recovery of two more miners' bodies. Rescue workers late today recovered the body of Joseph Kovach, 37 after having brought to the surface the body of F. G. Clark, 34, the other two bodies were recovered after a broken leg and shock. The other four men entombed were rescued yesterday and were sent to hospital for treatment of their injuries. Most seriously hurt was Patrick Harrington who suffered a broken leg and shock. The others are Griffith Jones, M. B. Crowe and William Susia, none of whom suffered serious injuries.
