In addition to the many prizes offered by the Nazareth waist Co. Moore & McLeod offered a series of prizes for the best sketches.

The vexed question of the licensing of produce vessels which has formed the text for many discourses on the part of both consumers and wholesalers in Sydney, C. B., since the passage of the ordinance three years ago has been put at rest, for a time at least by the amendment introduced last month by Ald. Fitzgerald and recently passed by the Sydney city council. Under the amendment Prince Edward Island vessels or vessels from any where for that matter, now dispose of their wares without applying to the authorities for a license so to do or being subjected to a fine of fifty dollars with a jail alternative for failing to take out such license. Previous to the passage of this amendment only the farmers or market gardeners who sold the produce of their farms were exempt from the embargo. The amendment reads as follows: Be it ordained by the city council of the City of Sydney as follows: Sec. 72, sub-sec. 6 is amended by striking out the words, "Nor to any farmer or market gardener selling within the city any produce of his farm or dairy," in the fifteenth and sixteenth lines thereof and substituting therefor the words, "Nor to any person selling within the city any produce of farm or garden."

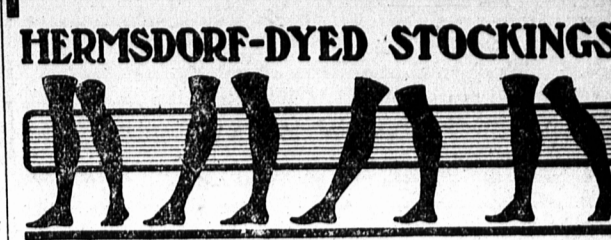
