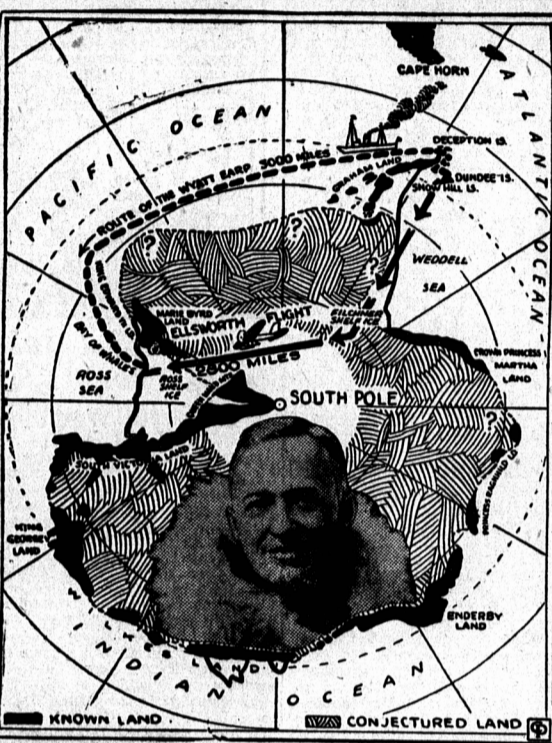
Parley Seeks To End Wheat Deadlock

BERLIN, May 22.—Two Catholic nuns, tear streaming down their white-hooded faces, today were sentenced to penitentiary terms for admitted violations of Nazi Germany's strict foreign exchange law.

While Stanley Baldwin, Lord President of the Council, said "I believe there was some light in that speech which was made at Berlin," he nevertheless expressed the opinion it would be easier to get an air agreement after Britain reached parity with Germany and France.

Hitler's advisers at Berlin said one of his prime purposes was to set European peace negotiations going again, but French officials termed the address "more words" designed to weaken Franco-British cooperation despite the German leader's conciliatory tone.

Rome was vexed at his apparent disinclination to send representatives to the forthcoming Danubian conference there and Vienna newspapers attacked his declaration of Austrian policy as "not especially friendly" though "less aggressive than formerly."

LONDON, May 22.—(C. P. Cable)—Previously-announced plans to expand the Royal Air Force were put in the shade by the government's announcement to Parliament today.

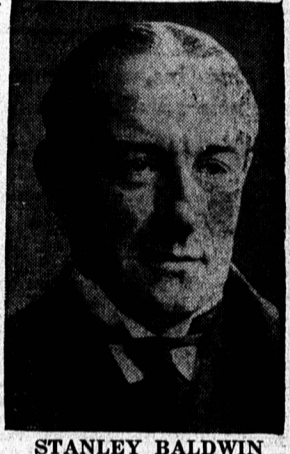
The domestic air force of first-line machines will be tripled within two years, whereas the first program called for some increases over five years. The new plan doubles within two years the number of machines at home that would have been furnished at the end of five years.

First-line fighting aircraft at home, instead of being increased to 840 in five years, will be increased to 1,500 by March 1937. Fifteen hundred planes, absolute parity with Germany and France, is the goal.

Mr. Baldwin found several points in the speech of Chancellor Adolf Hitler last night which he thought offered promise. In several directions Hitler had defined the German attitude. Points of his speech "deserve the closest and frankest study from all of us," he said.

Chief of Hitler's points meeting with approval of the Lord President of the Council, was his willingness, to conclude an air convention supplementing the Locarno treaty, with the indication it could be accompanied by an agreement on limitation of planes.

More than 50 Catholic orders are under investigation for alleged violations of the Devisen regulations, with five more trials scheduled for the immediate future. Next to face the stern Nazi judges are Franciscan Friars.
