Dealers in Alberton yesterday were paying thirty-eight cents a bus for white oats; thirty-nine cents a bus for black oats; eighteen cents a lb for butter; twenty cents a doz for eggs; nine and a quarter to nine and a half cents a lb for pork; nine cents a lb for hids and nine dollars a ton for loopy hay.
