MONTREAL, Nov. 27.—(CP)—There were 29 cattle, 62 sheep and lambs, 66 hogs, and 13 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today.
Grass calves were easier, other kinds of livestock were steady.
There were not enough cattle offered to make a market.
Veal calves ranged from \$8.50 to \$11. Grassers were easier, selling from \$4 to \$4.75, mostly \$4.25 to \$4.50.
Good ewes and wethers \$10, culls and bucks \$8, and sheep 3.50 to \$5.50.
Hogs were firm at \$10.85 for B-1 dressed, \$8.25 for B-1 alive fed and watered and \$8.35 off trucks. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$4.75 to \$5.50.
At Montreal, rail grade hogs brought \$10.70, rail grade sows number one up to 270 pounds \$7, number one over 270 pounds \$6, number two all weights \$5.
Cattle steers \$7.75, good \$7.25, medium \$6.25, fair \$5, common 4. Choice heifers \$7.50, good \$7, medium \$6, fair \$4.75, common \$4. Good cows \$5.25, medium \$4.25, fair \$3.75, Canners \$2 to \$2.25, cutters up to \$3.25. Boning bulls \$3 to \$3.25, butcher bulls \$4.50.
Veals \$5.50, grassers \$4.
Lambhubs 7.50, rail grade lambs \$17.50.

FINANCE

NEW YORK, Nov. 27.—(AP)—The stock market broke out of its lethargy of the past few days with a decisive slump today.
Dime Mines, in the Canadian section, fell back 1-4 points to 16 5-8 and International Nickel lost one point to 25 1-8. Smaller declines were registered by Dailers Seagram, Walkers, Brazilian Traction, Ford, Hollinger, Imperial Oil and Laidlaw. Most Quebec Power advanced 1-4 points to 10 1-2.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dropped 3/4 of a point to 43 1/2, where it was the lowest since mid-September, and as much as 6 1/2 points under the level of a year ago, despite the big increase in industrial production and corporate profits in the past 12 months.
A stock exchange membership sold for only \$33,000, lowest since 1899.
News included announcement by Secretary Knox that \$50,000,000 of "debt" funds had been allocated to development of naval bases acquired from England. The British trade report for October, showed imports had risen to about \$340,000,000, while exports dropped off to only \$23,000,000.
Among stocks down 2 to 3 points were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Douglas, Westinghouse, American Can, Allied Chemical and Chrysler, while those off a point or so included American Telephone, Boring, Martin, Anaconda, Pennsylvania and others.

NEW YORK, Nov. 27.—(CP)—The Far Eastern currencies and the Swiss franc and Argentine peso declined slightly in the foreign exchange market today.
The Hong Kong dollar lost 10 of 100 to 23 1/2 cents and the Shanghai dollar 1/10 of a cent to 6.07 cents in relation to the United States dollar. The Swiss franc and the peso fell 1/10 of a cent each to 33.21 and 23.60 cents respectively.
The free pound sterling at \$4.04 and the Canadian dollar at a discount of 12 1/2-16 per cent closed unchanged. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.00-9.91 per cent discount.)
