Losses Hold Advantage, Leaders Experience

On Montreal Market

MONTREAL, Dec. 5—(CP)—Price adjustments were irregular in transfers today on the stock exchange and curb market and losses had an advantage over gains. Industrials and papers were down in the indices and banks and golds were higher. Utilities broke even. Weaker in papers were Fraser and International, down more than a point, and Abitibi Common and Preferred, Price, Powell, Consolidated, M. and O., St. Lawrence Paper Preferred, Brown Preferred, Donnan, Quebec Pulp Preferred and Eddy McLaren, Dyden, H. Smith and B. C. Forest firmed and Brown common deleted a decrease.

Softer in industrials were Dosco, G. S. Wares, N. S. Car, Marconi, Ford, D. Engineering, Gypsum, C. Car "A", C. Locomotive and C. Sugar. On the upside were Massey, D. Bridge, C. Car Common, B. Products, Nuclear, Tar, E. Steel, D. Class, R. Mitchell, J. Bronze Preferred and General, Bruck and Celanese were harder in textiles. In beverages off were Seagrams, Also "A" and "B", Walker, Sicks and N. Breweries, C. Breweries was down for a time. Commercial All-Books shipped.

Gatineau, Shawinigan and I. Power pushed up in utilities and Brazilian, B. C. Power and Power Corporation lagged Commerce and Royal Improved in Banks and Montreal ended a rise. C.P.R. and Steamship Preferred fell back in carriers.

H. B. Mining and Noranda posted increases in metals and Nickel was on the downside. C. Oils was up and Imperial and B. A. easier in refiners. Buldo was better in solids and Royalite was pointed down in western oils. In junior mines, winners were Sullivan, E. Sullivan, Sons, Louvicut, Owen and Steele, MacDonald, Donald, Heva and Lingman dipped.

In loss territory in miscellaneous were Tobacco, Orange Famous Players Lithograph and Moore, Argus and Davis "A" did better. "Trading box score" 162500 shares; mines, 130'900; industrials, 32300; stocks lower 67; higher, 41; unchanged 59; new high 1; new low 4.

Leaders Experience Moderate Reverses

(By Victor Eubank, Associated Press Staff Writer)

NEW YORK, Dec. 5—(AP)—Stock market leaders with scattered exceptions suffered moderate reverses today despite Wall Street's continued uptick thinking regarding a possible coal price which touched off Wednesday's rally. The list was down at the start, came back around midday, dipped again and reduced its losses running to 2 or more points in the final hour when President Green of the A.F.L. proposed a conference of mine operators and union officials to settle the fuel dispute. The Associated Press 60-stock average was off 1 of a point at 634.

Except for Hiram Walker's 1 1-8 point drop, Canadian stocks eased only slightly. Both Canadian Pacific and Dome Mines slipped 1-8. Distillers Secum gained 3-8 Lake Shore, on the curb, declined 1-2. Favorable dividends lifted Colgate-Palmolive 2-3-8, 4-3-4 and Continental Baking 5-8 at 20 3-4. Dow Chemical was up 3 at 164 1-2 and Johns-Manville 2 at 150 on foreign sale. Huggins Public Service added 2 1-8 at 28 1-8. Plus marks were retained by Woolworth, Goodrich, North American, International Harvester, Standard Oil (N.J.), Westinghouse, Allied Chemical and NY Central.

In the casualty division were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, American Telephone, Consolidated Edison, Good-year, Montgomery Ward, Caterpillar Tractor, Douglas Aircraft, Anacostia, American Smelting, Air Reduction, General Electric, Eastman Kodak, Santa Fe, Southern Pacific, Southern Railway and Great Northern.

Livestock SUMMARY

Cattle marketings, while not unseasonably heavy, were mostly of lower quality, serving to drive prices down to some extent at principal markets. The decline mostly affected inferior grades. Other live stock sold strong, with good gains made on calves and lambs at Toronto and Montreal.

Eastern Cattle Markets

An early gain of 15 to 25 cents at TORONTO was lost by the close, despite a moderate cattle run, and a few hundred stockers were left unsold at the finish. Weighty steers were priced at \$11.50 to \$12.75, with a small lot topping at \$14 and butcher steers \$10.50 to \$12.75. Stockers were slow movers at \$9.50 to \$12. Bulk of the receipts at Montreal were cows, but prices were firm to 25 cents higher on active trading. Some fairly good to good quality steers sold at \$12 to \$12.50 with a few \$13, and good butchers lots around \$9.50 to a top of \$10.50, but mostly \$9.50 to \$10. In the MARITIMES, receipts were mostly of common quality but prices remained steady, with medium to good steers and heifers \$11.25 to \$11.75 delivered and medium cows up to \$9.

Western Cattle Markets

Cattle offerings at WINNIPEG held up very well, despite adverse weather conditions, but the trade eased in price toward the close. MIL Power, with the better grades about 25 cents lower and other slaughter 23 1-2 to \$12.50. Most slaughter steers of good quality brought \$12.50 to \$13, but the bulk of the others rated \$10.50 to \$12. A heavy run sold on an active market at CALGARY, with good to choice steers \$11.75 to \$12.50, while EDMONTON paid \$11.75 to \$12.50 on a steady market. PRINCE ALBERT up to \$12.50 for good steers, MOOSE JAW \$12, SASKATOON up to \$12.50. REGINA \$12.50 and VANCOUVER \$12 to \$12.25.

Exports to United States

Exports of dairy cattle to the United States during the week totalled 1,661 head, compared with 1,326 in the same week last year. This year's exports to date totalled 65,017 compared with 45,533 in the same period last year.
