AS TO THE PAROLING OF PRISONERS.

In dealing with crime juries are mainly lenient and merciful. A merciful judge bids them give the prisoner the benefit of any reasonable doubt.

No doubt it is a mistake to imagine that all who are convicted of crimes are so much worse than many against whom a charge has never been laid.

Truly we are unmerciful to the murderers we hand! They, at least, get no benefit from the parole system, no abatement of the penalty.

THE CHANCES IN THE CARDIGAN ELECTION.

At the last general election in this town, the city seats being awarded to the Liberal candidates by acclamation.

There were 9,131 Liberal votes against 8,317 Conservative votes cast

the proportion being 52 Liberal to 48 Conservative. At the same election Mr. Morson carried the Third District of Kings for the Conservative party by a vote of 563 to 417 for Mr. Clay the Liberal candidate, his majority being 136, or about 13 per cent of the votes cast.

It would be useless to disguise the fact that there is a considerable interest among politicians in the by-election to be held a few weeks hence to fill the vacancy caused by Mr. Morson's resignation.

As for that certain of the Liberals tell that Mr. Morson had been several times over the course and was a very strong candidate, not afraid of the face of Clay, so to speak, and hence his majority, while now the name of Nelson, namesake of the Victor of Trafalgar and the Nile, is one to conjure with.

As to Mr. Dewar a Conservative tells of him as quite a redoubtable fighter—on the platform. One notable exploit is recounted—it was years ago—in which he first encountered Sir Louis Davies in one hall, and then after furious driving over bad roads, confronted Horace Hassard in another hall the same night.

Wherefore, bearing in mind Sir John Macdonald's dictum that elections, like horse races are always uncertain, any reasonable speculations as to the chances must be based upon certain well known facts, qualified by certain other and unknown quantities.

There are perhaps a very few who blame Mr. Morson for taking office and deserting his constituents. There are more who are pleased with his appointment, possibly some of them sufficiently so to feel a little warmer toward the Government.
