bells, muskeg, tamarack swamps; a lonely eerie country where the only necessary stops were the divisional points, where there were no roads, no houses, no farms. During the war one of its important stations was an internment camp. Up there, far in the north, the German prisoners who escaped must stick to the railroad tracks or die in the wilderness. That made the job of holding hostages a simple one.

Incidentally, this Transcontinental was one of the most fortunate mistakes in the history of railroading. It began as a road across the wilderness; today it is approaching maturity and a condition of opulence: It is at the stations of this road that the prospectors gather to jump off for new gold fields; one of its feeders is the tremendous copper camp of Rouyn. The dog teams took off from it for the gold fields of Red Lake, Pickle Lake, Crow and Woman Lake; there is an excellent geological opinion that, along the height of land adjacent to this railway, which, years ago plunged into the brush with no hope of revenue save at its two points of terminus, lies one of the really great gold deposits of the world. Not long ago a settler along its route sold out for \$60,000 because he had found gold while digging a post hole.

It is the steel backbone today of a tremendous endeavour, French-Canadian pioneers, filtering west through Northern Quebec have conquered its bush for farms; thousands of settlers are there now where a decade or so ago there were only hundreds. (Continued)
