As the opening of St. Dunstan's on Tuesday, the 9th inst., necessitates the return of Father Mullally there, he was waited upon by a committee of the parishioners on Sunday last, immediately after Mass, and presented with the following address, accompanied by a well-filled purse:—

Address
To Reverend Finlay Mullally,
Dear Rev. Father:

As the impending opening of the new scholastic term at St. Dunstan's University predicated your return to take up your professional duties there, the people of this parish would fain express to you, in at least some degree, before your departure, their sentiments of appreciation and gratitude for the pleasant mutual relations established during the term of your temporary pastorate here.

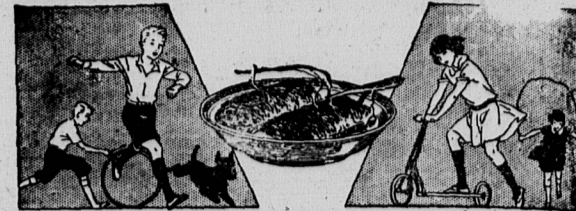

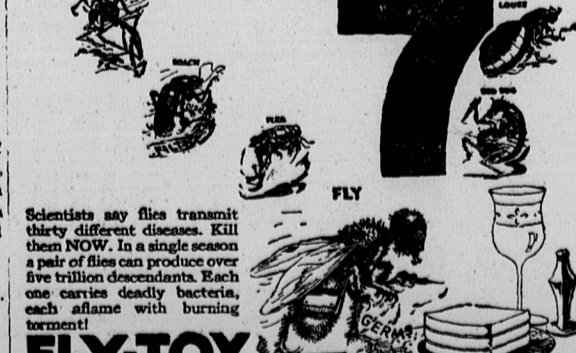
