WELL-KNOWN VESSEL LOST---The schooner Ponthook, which has made frequent trips to Charlottetown, was sunk in a peculiar manner on Oct. 30th, according to a despatch from Galveston, Texas. The despatch states that when the vessel shipped sea the cargo of dried codfish swelled to such an extent that the vessel's seams were opened causing her to sink. The Norwegian steamer Kronstad, two days out from the Azores, sighted the Ponthook in a sinking condition, and rescued her crew on the night of October 30 in a heavy sea. The Ponthook was en route from St. John's for Gibraltar. Captain Doyle and the seven men of the Ponthook were landed at Ponta Delgada, Azores.
