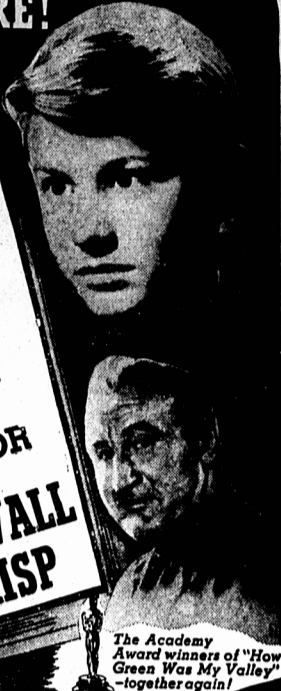

will be among the subscribers. Particularly my thoughts are with the women in my own category - the farmer's wives. I think too of the various sources, whence that money to be so invested, comes. There's an old adage "Save the pennies and the dollars will take care of themselves." This is indeed very often the way we farm women have our income - in pennies. We save perhaps from the egg-money, or the chicken money so much to have a "nest egg of mine". We save so carefully for there are so many things to remember when we even think of spending. There was the depression following the last war, when a bond would have helped us much. Could we have repaid of that? It is a trite saying but I have noticed very true: History repeats itself. We women have to make do with what we have. Instead of the roar of guns we have bird-song at dawn and "what if the ducks come down". We are not taken as forced laborers. We dig and plant our gardens in peace - a labor of love. We do not burn our cherished homes as part of a scorched earth policy. We clean and polish and enjoy our own. Neither we nor our children are starving. We have plenty, and to spare. It is no sacrifice for women on Island farms - or off-is - to make to make over to save to buy bonds, so to bring our boys home, to bring the blessed days of peace nearer and as security for ourselves in days to come. So I feel sure that every woman from East Point to West Cape, from the Strait of Northumberland to the South to the cold waters of the Gulf on the North will do everything in her power to secure bonds for herself and her loved ones. Where we serve, we may not do it's or that to bid the war effort in some spectacular way, but we
