U.S. Storm Warning System Ready For Annual Invasion of Hurricanes

WASHINGTON—(UPI)—Uncle Sam is ready for the 1949 hurricane season with the most efficient storm warning set-up ever devised.

Navy, Air Force, Civil Aeronautics Administration and the U. S. Weather Bureau have pooled their equipment and talents. They are aiming at preventing a single loss of life this year from tropical storms, and at keeping property damage at a minimum.

An area of sea off the southeastern coast of the U. S. and over the Gulf of Mexico, roughly 3000 by 1500 miles, is now under 24-hour-a-day watch. The most modern radar, seismographic and other weather instruments, plus hundreds of airplanes, are being used in this work.

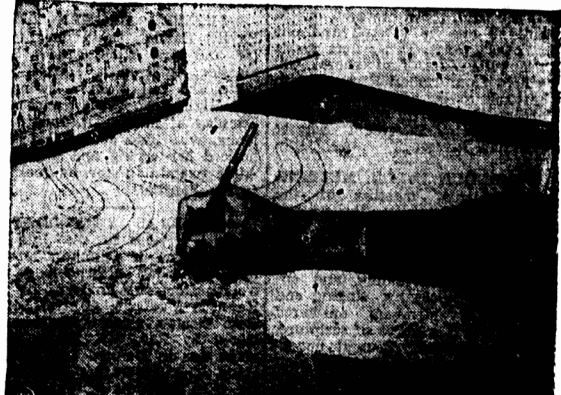
The official hurricane season is June 1 through Nov. 30. The center of the season, however, during which the most violent storms usually occur, is between Aug. 20 and Sept. 20.

First news of a developing tropical storm usually comes from such sources as ships at sea, commercial airliners, OAA and Weather Bureau stations, long range radar or the Navy's microseismic network which picks up earth and sea tremors caused by air disturbances.

These reports locate the storm approximately. Then Navy and Air Force hurricane patrols fly into the teeth of the gale in an effort to locate the "eye". Only when the eye is found can the correct path, speed and direction of the disturbance be plotted.

This method gives about a 24-hour advance notice of where a hurricane will hit the shore. It is this warning which is so vital to saving lives and property.

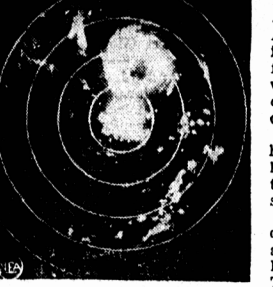
Main base of the Navy's fliers doing this work is Miami. There are also hurricane patrols out of Pensacola, Fla., Corpus Christi, Tex., and other bases. Air Force planes also use Miami as well as the Navy's Bermuda and Puerto Rico. All information on hurricanes is co-ordinated in Miami. In case a severe storm should wreck Miami's fixed where the lines intersect.

Two new flight proceedings were developed last year, and will be used this season. Navy fliers discovered that most hurricanes have a narrow back door, through which pilots can fly into the eye and encounter practically no disturbance.

Air Force fliers also developed a system of flying a complete square around the outside of a storm, and, by plotting diagonal lines through their squared route on a map, the eye of the storm is fixed where the lines intersect.

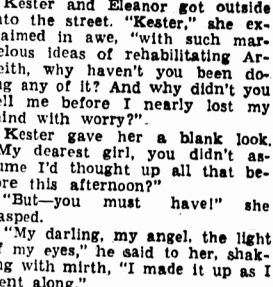
