Gestapo try Traps to catch Loyal Dutch

(CP)—The German Gestapo in Holland trooped over its failure to round up organizers of street fights, strikes, sabotage and campaigns of organized insubordination to Nazi troops, it has resorted to traps with a "help Britain" bait to catch the culprits. Radio Orange, the Netherlands government broadcasting station in Britain, has issued a warning to loyal Dutchers not to be caught by the Gestapo trick, and Vrij Nederland, the free Dutch newspaper published here, has received from its own sources information concerning the sort of trap the Gestapo is believed to have laid successfully.
