UNDER QUARANTINE.—The Montreal papers of last evening contain reports of the scarlatina epidemic that is raging in Ste. Anne de Bellevue. In consequence of the outbreak Macdonald College has been placed under quarantine by the executive in charge. There are at present four cases in the College, two boys, one girl, and a servant. There are a number of students from this province and city in attendance at the institution, for whom their friends and relatives will be anxious. It will be good news to them to learn the report given by the principal, Dr. P. C. Harrison. He says in part: "While the outbreak in the College is not serious, we have to adopt quarantine, in self-protection, in order to keep our pupils away from the shops and infested district. In about a week's time I expect to be able to lift the self-imposed quarantine. The health of the institution is otherwise excellent."

VICTORIA SHIPPING.—The Schr. Lizette Catherine arrived in port on Friday last. She was piloted from Charlottetown by Captain Allan McLean, Captain of the W. Parnell O'Hara. Her cargo, consisting of one hundred and twenty-five barrels flour, ten bbls. sugar and fifty boxes raisins for Wright Bros., was discharged Saturday. She began loading produce on Monday and her cargo is now nearly completed. Captain Miller is in command. The Schr. Roma, in charge of Captain McLeod, arrived on Saturday. Her cargo consisted of salt and kerosene oil. She is now loading produce from Wright Bros.—The Schr. H. H. Kitchener, commanded by Captain Haughn, arrived in ballast on Sunday. When chartered by Wright Bros. she had tending to sail for Port Hastings. Her ballast was taken out Monday and she is now being loaded with produce by Wright Bros.—The Schr. W. Parnell O'Hara, jointly owned by E. Boswell and Captain Allan McLean, having her cargo of coal discharged is laid up for the winter.—The Schr. Alena L. Young, owned by Calvin Howatt and commanded by George Gamble, has also had her cargo of coal discharged and has been laid up for the winter.—V.

panies incorporated there; they simply incorporate under the Companies' Act and it is for the shareholders and subscribers to protect themselves. A report upon what appears to be the best authority states that the Canadian Home Investment Company still exists and will continue, but no new contracts will be issued. These parties claim a loan reserve fund of \$50,000 and that that contracts will be carried on till maturity or until the contract-holders exercise the option of taking preferred stock in the Alpha Company for their proportion of the loan fund reserve. The Alpha is a loan company formed to invest the loan fund of the Canadian Home Investment Company. Each director has to buy \$10,000 stock at \$110. No other preferred shares are to be sold except as exchange for Canadian Home Investment Company's contracts. So far as can be told, the contract holders are as safe in paying up their contracts as they ever were and possibly more so. It depends, as it did before, on the way in which the loan fund is handled.

Y. M. C. A. WORK.—Two students from the Prince of Wales College will attend the quadrennial convention of the world's Student Volunteer Movement to be held in Kansas City, Mo., from December 31 to January 4. The students who will go are J. Sidney Bonnell and Vans McLean. The decision to send delegates and their appointment was made yesterday at a meeting of the boys of the college after the session. It came as a result of the visit here of Mr. E. H. Clarke, Canadian National Student secretary, who has just completed a tour of the colleges of the Maritime Provinces. Mr. Clarke was here on Tuesday evening and at a conference with the student cabinet pointed out the value of having the college represented at this convention at which there will be about 4,000 student delegates. The idea spread rapidly among the students and reached its climax at the meeting yesterday. One of the students will go partly at his own expense. The balance is being subscribed by the other students and some friends who are interested in the enterprise. Thirty-seven dollars was subscribed towards this fund at yesterday's meeting, at which Mr. Percy Keeping was chairman.
