**STANDING OF PARTIES**

(Toronto Globe.)  
The man in the street no doubt wants to know something of the standing of the parties and the probable result of the general election. The composition of the House of Commons when it was dissolved was:

Of the four seats now vacant by reason of the death of the former member, three—St. Hyacinthe, Que.; Prescott, Ont., and S. Kirk, Man.—were held by Liberals. The fourth, Sherbrooke, Que., was represented by a Conservative, those classed as independents are Hon. J. I. Carter, St. Mary's, Montreal; J. H. Robinson, West-Elgin, Ont.; A. W. Potts, Winnipeg, and Ralph Smith, Vancouver. Of these Hon. Mr. Carter may be classed as a supporter of the government, except upon the question of extreme protection, and Messrs. Potts and Smith were elected as labor liberals and have given the government a general support, which is justified by its advanced labor legislation. Mr. J. H. Robinson, elected as an independent, has given his support to the opposition as a rule, although, if re-elected, he is expected upon a vote of want of confidence to vote against the government.

The first party division of the late Parliament was taken on April 24, 1901, when the parties lined up as follows: Government, 132; opposition, 70. Durlan was unrepresented and Hon. Mr. Fontaine, a Liberal, was unrepresented and Terrabonne. The House was then composed of 413 members, the Yukon having since been given a representative. At the last general election the government had 37 supporters elected in Ontario, 38 in Quebec, 15 in Nova Scotia, 9 in New Brunswick, 3 in Prince Edward Island, 3 in Manitoba, 3 in British Columbia and 1 in the Territories.

In the new House, as a result of the redistribution of seats following upon the census, Ontario will have 80 seats instead of 92, Nova Scotia 18 instead of 20, New Brunswick 13 instead of 11 and Prince Edward Island 4 instead of 3. The ten seats so obtained go to the West. Manitoba gets 10 instead of 7, the Territories 10 instead of 4, and British Columbia 7 instead of 6.

AMERICAN flour has advanced 20c per barrel. European wheat reports are 50 per cent. short. Prices of flour in Canada are expected to advance as soon as exporting of new wheat commences, which will be very soon.

The firemen were called out at two yesterday afternoon for an alarm on King Square. They were quickly to the spot and discovered a slight fire in the blue of W. E. Bentley's house. It was extinguished without trouble.

TWENTY lives were lost and ten fishing vessels wrecked the past year in the Gloucester fisheries. Fewer men have been lost from Gloucester vessels during the past twelve months than in any year since 1885, while, on the other hand, the financial loss on vessels wrecked, which were valued at \$130,800, is greater than in any but three previous years since 1830. The insurance on the vessels amounted to \$88,158. Of the men lost all but three were single.

This popular boat leaves Bermuda January 19th, 1905, and visits Bermuda, Porto Rico, Jamaica, Cuba, and Nassau, making a 31 days tour of the Caribbean region. The tour is under the auspices of the Raymond and Whitcomb Company and the price of tickets are \$15, \$130, \$160, according to location and size of state-room. Though the Halifax is licensed to carry 500 passengers the number this trip will be limited to 130, ensuring a maximum of comfort to all.

At the Police Court yesterday, David Egan, aged 22, Mount Stewart was given six months with hard labor for the larceny of a razor from James & Trainor. Egan had come in to the political meeting Tuesday night and during the evening had a quarrel with a lad named Carragher who works with James & Trainor. Wednesday he went into the barber shop to arrange a settlement with Carragher offering not to prosecute if the latter paid him \$1. While they were talking in the rear room Carragher was called out and a few minutes later prisoner left. A razor was shortly mis-laid, the police were informed and Officer Harper found Egan at Mrs. Coyle's. He denied having stolen the article but when searched it was found in his sock. Yesterday in Court he said it had been given him in lieu of the dollar but the Magistrate thought otherwise and gave him six months. A number of the women folk of the section of the city opposite the P. E. I. Hospital known as Arichat, aired a dispute with Court but no fines were inflicted.

An occurrence of an exceptionally sad nature took place on Saturday, the 15th, inst, when Thos Kiekham an employee of the N.S. Steel Co., at Ferrona met with his death caused by falling from a staging to the ground. A special train bore him to the Aberdeen Hospital where all that medical skill could do was done for him but he passed away a few hours later. The esteem in which he was held was evidenced by the constant stream of visitors that poured in to offer their last tribute of love and respect to the dead. His funeral which was largely attended, took place on Tuesday morning from the Church of St. John the Baptist after a requiem high mass by Rev. J. D. McLeod deceased who was a son of Thomas and Elizabeth Kiekham of New Haven, was of an exceptionally fine disposition, sober, mild and always spared everything contrary to a good Christian life. He was a devout Catholic and was in his twenty-sixth year. The gratitude of the afflicted widow and parents is extended to all who helped by their sympathy to mitigate the severity of the blow and lessen the anguish of the cross sent by an all-wise Father.

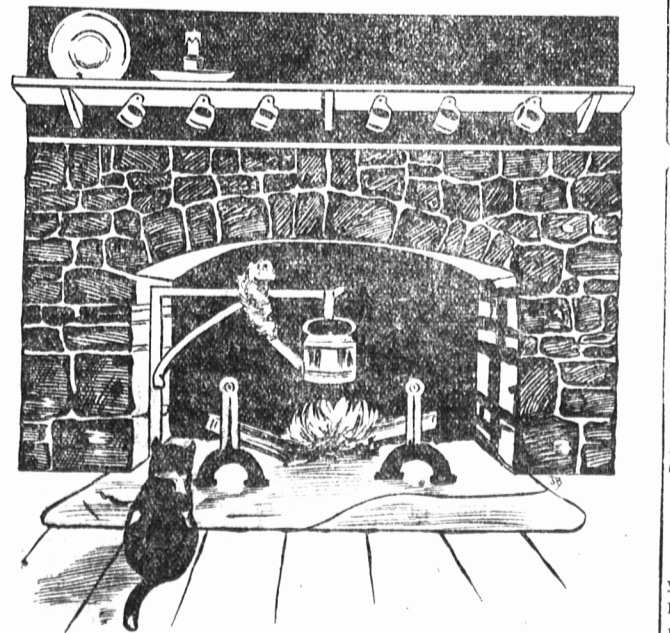
