Most youngsters would as soon swim as eat. They should be taught to avoid extremes, and in the case of young and inexperienced children special precautions should be taken to ensure their safety while in the water.

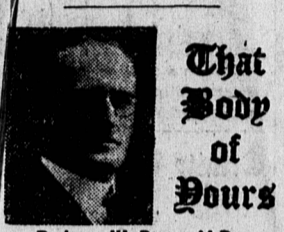

CORRECTING BACK DEFORMITIES

As you have watched children with back deformities, sharp curves to either side or an actual lump or hump on the spinal column, you have perhaps wondered if anything could be done to prevent or reduce the deformity.

For years various exercises, and putting the child in steel frames and plaster casts, have been used with varying degrees of success.

Unfortunately there are cases where all these methods are of no avail, and the individual seems doomed to carry this deformity with its injurious effect upon health and happiness.

Where there is a projection of the ribs backward, large sections of these ribs are actually removed. These rib fragments that have been removed are used to take the place of part of the spine bones that are deformed or shortened.

Dr. S. K. Kleinbeig, New York, reviews fifty four cases of all varieties of spinal curvature on which operation has been performed.

The operation has no ill effect upon the health of the patient and does not interfere with normal growth.

There were 9 percent failures, 13 percent good results, and 78 percent excellent results.

Thus in 91 percent of the patients operated on, the deformity has been arrested, the appearance of the back satisfactory, the patient has gained weight and strength, and there is no backache.

Now this treatment means a certain length of time on a steel frame before operation, and after that the wearing of a support for some time.

However I think you'll admit that it is worth the health and happiness of the child, and in the years to come the feeling of satisfaction to parents that they have done everything possible for their youngster if something that cannot be measured.

WOLFE'S REBUKE TO HIS BRIGADIERS

Q. What was Wolfe's rebuke to his Brigadiers? A. Early on the morning of September 12, 1759, there was a rumor in the British camp of a proposed attack on Quebec.
