NEW YORK, May 4—(CP)—Little action took place on the foreign exchange market Saturday. The pound Sterling closed unchanged for the fifth day in a row at \$4.03 1-2 in terms of United States funds. The Canadian dollar continued its slow downward trend after the steady gains of two weeks ago, losing 1-16 cent to a discount of 12 1-8 per cent. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.09—99 per cent discount.) Trading for the week was narrow with Sterling showing a 1-4 cent gain from last Monday and the D-minion currency falling 3-8 cents. The Swiss franc and the Shanghai dollar were up slightly and the Argentine "free" peso declined 1-20 cent at 23.55.

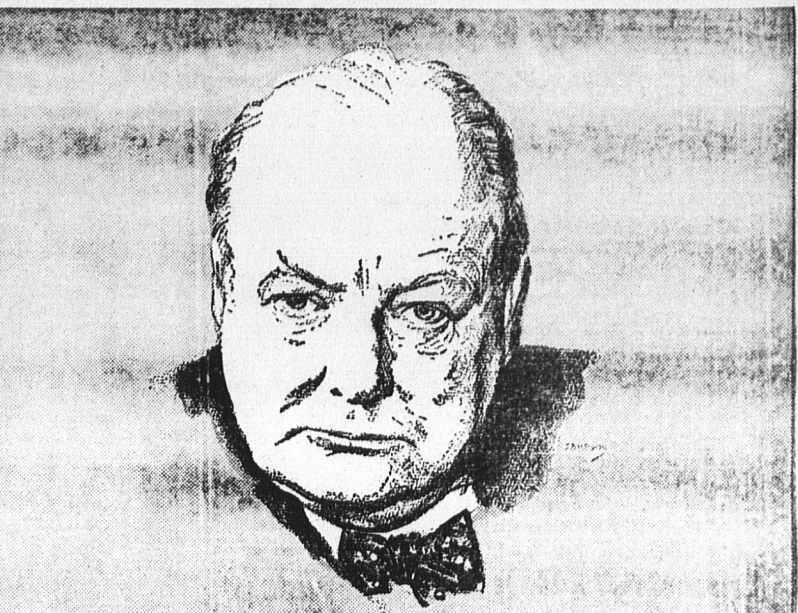
