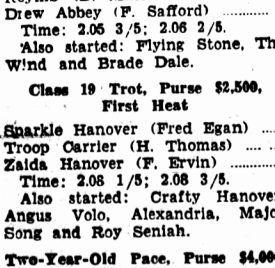
## Grand Circuit Racing Results
