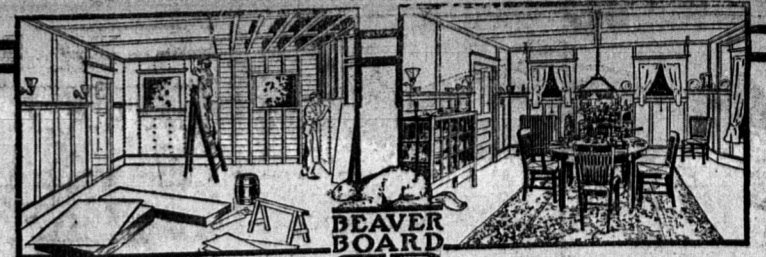
DROWNING ACCIDENT.—The following particulars of the drowning of Mr. Hugh McLellan of Vancouver, who was a native of St. George's, P. E. I., is taken from the Vancouver Sun of Nov. 7th.—Mr. Hugh McLellan of 1044 Melville Street, Vancouver, one of the most widely known and respected of the old-timers of this city, was drowned on Saturday night in the dark waters of the Fraser river, while a heavy fog concealed the banks. The empty boat in which he attempted to cross the river was discovered floating, Sunday morning, near Port Kells, but no trace of Mr. McLellan could be found. On Saturday night Mr. McLellan crossed the river from his ranch to Port Hammond, to buy groceries and secure his mail. When he was ready to return he found that the fog was so thick he could scarcely see the length of his boat, so he returned to the shore and purchased a lantern, which he filled with oil and lit, placing it in the end of the boat. He then pushed off in the fog and that was the last seen of him. The next morning the boat was found with one oar missing and the lantern still burning in the end, where he had placed it. Since that time every effort has been made to recover the body, but so far fruitlessly. Mr. McLellan was one of the first men to settle in the village which eventually became Vancouver. He was widely known and liked among all the old-timers of whom his sudden death will be a severe blow.
