No Leakage Through Holland And Scandinavia

LONDON, January 23.—In connection with foodstuffs reaching the coast, the British government recently sent a specially qualified business man on a mission to Holland and Scandinavia to investigate whether the legislation at the various capitals were doing their work efficiently in supervising agreements and contracts for preventing leakage to Germany. On his return he reported to the government that everything possible was being done to prevent such leakage.

In behalf of the government it is argued that, although in the early months after the order-in-council, large amounts of contraband did succeed in reaching Germany, the blockade since June has been very strict, and is ever growing more efficient. Moreover, it is added, the Danish agreement only became operative in November and if the statistics of trade since November were published they would show how the blockade is continually tightening.

84TH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BANK OF N. S.

U. S. CAN'T HOLD ME, BOAST OF LINCOLN THE SPY.

NEW YORK, January 23.—The New York American this morning prints the following:
"Every arm of the Federal Secret Service and the police force for Ignatius T. T. Lincoln, the self-confessed German secret service agent who escaped from Deputy United States Marshall Johnson in Brooklyn on Saturday. The deputy marshal was suspended. Meanwhile, Lincoln calmly walked the streets. He conversed with traffic policemen and even lounged around the corridors of the Federal building. Finally, he came into the New York American office with the following statement:
"I have read with much interest the fragmentary reports of my escape in this morning's newspapers. The United States Government may find consolation in the fact that they are not the government whom I have outwitted, and from whose careful, without routine vigilance, I have easily escaped."

"The full story of the why and how of my escape cannot as yet be told—this I will tell in a further article which I promise shall reach you as soon as certain events have taken place. At the outset I should like to say that I am sincerely sorry for the precarious position in which United States Deputy Marshall Johnson finds himself. It would be unjust to punish him. Not all the forces of the United States secret service could have prevented the carrying out of my carefully laid scheme."

METEOR DIFFERENCES.

Meteors or "shooting stars" show striking differences of color, which Dr. Alfred Wegener has recently attempted to explain. The earth's atmosphere is now believed to have three fairly distinct strata—the first, extending up to about 45 miles, having nitrogen as the leading constituent; the second, with its upper limit at about 125 miles, being chiefly hydrogen; and the third, at a still greater height, consisting of a very thin gas, which has been named "geocoronium." Meteors coming from outer spaces are not sufficient in heated in the exceedingly light gas to become luminous. Their fall through the hydrogen layer causes them to become incandescent, and before they reach the lowest stratum most of them are completely dissipated. A few of the largest, however, penetrate the nitrogen atmosphere, a very small number reaching the earth's surface. It is found that the deep-falling meteors pass through three stages of color—yellow-white, green, and deep red—and it is concluded that the green is due to incandescence of the hydrogen and the red to that of the nitrogen. Only the first stage is seen in the quickly dissipated meteors—the white, yellow or sometimes reddishness being evidently the glow of the meteor substance.
