ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

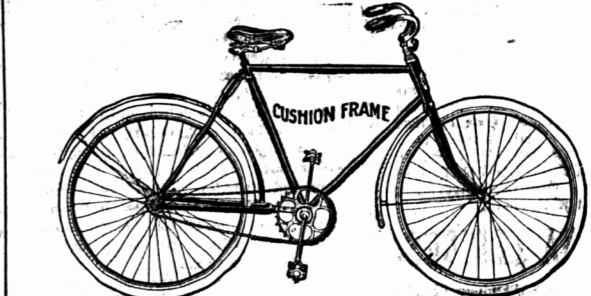

A. By Law for levying and specifying the rate of assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property and Poll in the City of Charlottetown for a Water and Sewerage fund under Statute 1, Edward VII Chapter 2.

The rate of assessment on Real Estate for a Water and Sewerage fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the general assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property, liable to taxation in said City and all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned 1: them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1906.

Rate of assessment on Personal Property for such Water and Sewerage Fund for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the said City in said general Assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

The amount of Poll tax to be paid by every person returning by the said assessors in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll as aforesaid for such water fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of twenty five cents on every poll of every person so assessed and returned as aforesaid.
