WHAT DEFEAT WOULD MEAN TO RUSSIA.

Wanda Ian-Ruban, a Russian lady, has contributed to The Outlook quite a striking article under the above caption. At the beginning of the article the writer takes note of the obvious sympathy of most Americans for Japan, and also that defeat in the war would mean to Russia a severe check to her commercial expansion through the loss of Manchuria, and a still greater loss of prestige among the nations, not to mention the crippling of her financial resources.

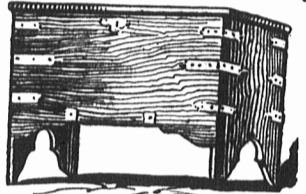
According to this writer the Government is being more and more separated from the people by its repressive measures. Many of the more intelligent, and even certain dukes and princes believe that autocracy has failed and is doomed, and are in favor of a constitutional government. The influence of the opposition party is increasing at a most formidable rate, while revolutionists are now uniting in definite organization against a common enemy. Revolutionary literature is sent across the boundary into Russia in vastly increased quantities, and is found by the police in a house search—a thing which would have meant banishment ten years ago.—the accused answers simply, "I cannot prevent the sending of these journals to my house. You probably receive and read them also." In a recent circular by General Kuropatkin, sent by him to all the generals of the army, he calls attention to the widespread and increasing dissemination of revolutionary literature among the soldiers, and call

for still stronger measures for its suppression.

The intolerable cruelties and oppressions to which the people of Russia are subjected are not new. They have been repeated for generations past, but the writer gives new instances in which bribery and corruption of the grossest character are coupled with oppression: where millions from the national treasury are bestowed upon favorites, while the Czar himself only recently gave orders to have added to his private possessions, paying therefor 300,000 rubles, state forests of which the authoritative valuation is placed at 100,000,000 rubles! Such is official Russia today from the Czar down to the meanest official who does his bidding, the latter carefully chosen from the worst elements in the nation. Under these conditions the people in Russia who love liberty do not desire that the soldiers of the Czar shall prove victorious in the present war: "The government, if victorious, could float loans, now impossible, not to mention the huge sums it could extort from Japan. The army would be paid and praised. It would go home in a blaze of glory, laden with booty to be made the recipient of honors and medals. A victorious army, with money and spoils in its possession is bound to be loyal; and just as long as Russia is able to maintain in her army a

compliant and quickly yielded tool, just so long will she be able to obliterate alien governments and to keep her own a cause for shame to herself and of sorrow to her well-wishers. But if the government is defeated in this war, Russia at large will suffer nothing worse from this defeat than the loss of money of which she would in no case have enjoyed the use, which cannot even be squeezed from her, since she is impoverished to the point of beggary as it is; the loss of commercial advantages of which she would never have reaped the profits. . . . But given one taste of self-reliance, of independent thought and the yoke of a worn-out despotism will be thrown off forever. Then at last will the real Russia emerge, her natural resources boundless in extent, her zeal and patience efficient and therefore untiring, her people virile and eager for all knowledge, all skill. She will go forward by what will seem to be leaps and bounds.

Thus there are many, how many we may not know, but this writer believes there are millions of Russians, wholly devoted to their country, who are praying for defeat rather than for the victory in the present war, in the belief that defeat will hasten the day of Russian emancipation. The writer we are following believes that the time is ripe for a great overturn in Russia, an overturn that will shatter the corrupt and cruel power of the Autocrat and of the church hierarchy and the bureaucracy which together now hold the people in ignorant serfdom and suffering under intolerable oppression and cruelties. It may be that in this way the blessings of freedom will come to Russia. We greatly fear, however, that the time may not be so near as Madame Ian-Ruban hopes; and that the friends of liberty in Russia have yet great sufferings to endure before the desire of their hearts shall be reached. Despotism has always died hard.
