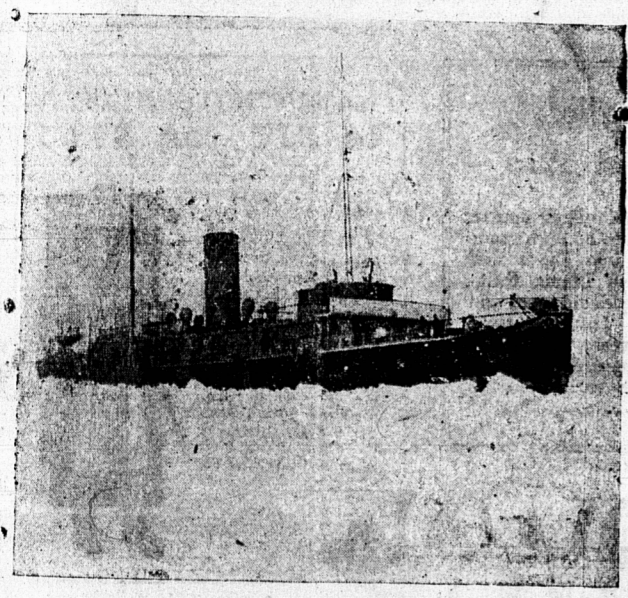

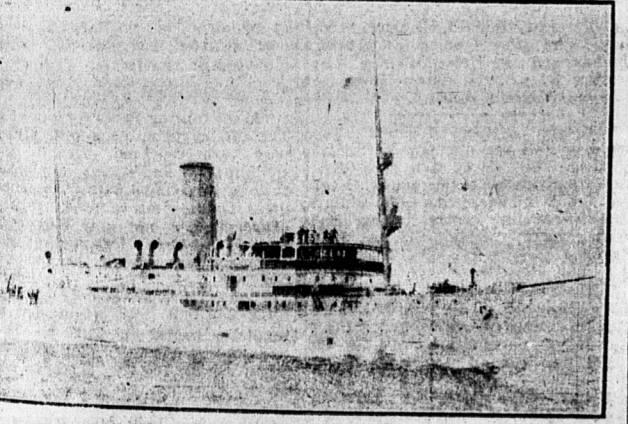

IMMIGRATION TO CANADA.
SPOKANE, Wash., April 30.—The socialistic drift in England and revolution in the government that resulted in the radical handling of the House of Lords, and the economic distress among millions of the submerged masses have stirred British society of the depths, says the Spokesman-Review in a leading editorial. It seems natural that emigration from Great Britain this year should be reported as being heavier than for many years previous.

The immigration of the young and middle aged, of the robust and enterprising restricted to no class. The son of the peer and the unskilled laborer alike swarm forth from the tight little island of cramped opportunity to the larger leeway offered by Australia, Canada and South Africa.

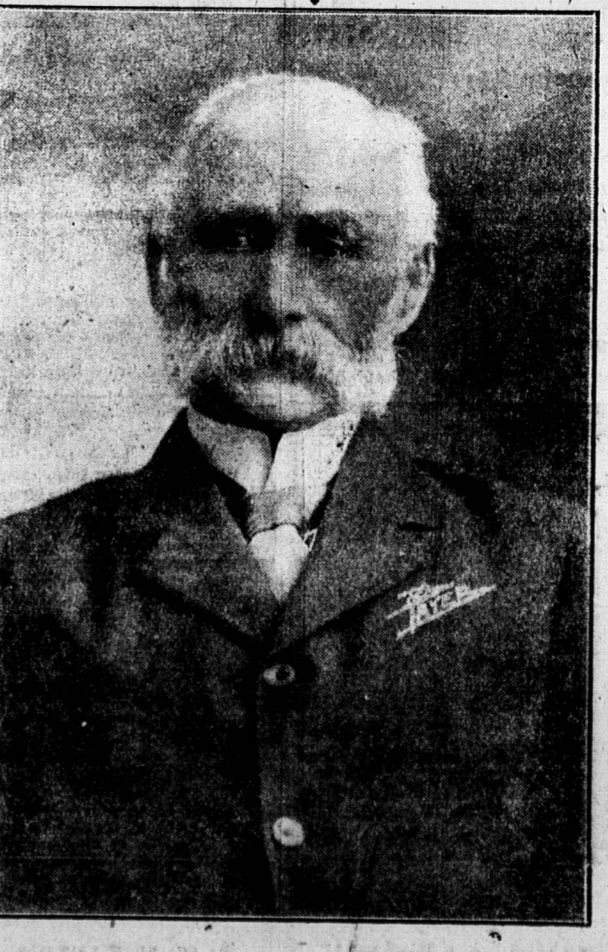
