This sole head of a family or any state over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.
