## TURKS MAY FIGHT THE BULGARIANS

CONSTANTINOPLE, Aug. 31.—The sudden resignation of the Bulgarian diplomatic agent here is a serious symptom of the strained relations between Turkey and Bulgaria. The possibility of war between the two powers is generally admitted. Should there be a clash, a Bulgarian victory is highly probable. It is rumored that the Sultan has ordered M. Arif Pasha, commander of the Second Adrianople army corps, to prepare for mobilization on the Bulgarian frontier. The Turkish inspector-general of frontiers has been summoned to Yildiz Kiosk.

## IN METHODIST CHURCH.

The following lay members were present: J. A. Hince, Summerside; Colin McKay, Bideford; W. H. Smith, Cascumpeque; Albert Murray, Cape Wolfe; and Artemas Boutler, O'Leary; Jonathan Smith, of Kingston, was also present.

The estimated receipts from Cape Wolfe, Bideford and O'Leary Missions were a little in advance of last year, and the Semi-Independent Circuits—Margate, Granville and Alberton are planning to do for their Ministers this year as well as last. The connexial funds and their assessments on the Circuits were greatly adjusted.

Arrangements were made for missionary, educational and sustentation fund services on all the circuits of the district. Sunday School matters were fully considered and the importance of this work was acknowledged by all present.

A communication from Rev. Dr. Chown regarding temperance work, was before the meeting and the particular matter referred to was the appointment of circuit committees had the required attention.

A paper on the preparation of sermons, by Rev. F. A. Wightman, was read and was discussed by both the laity and the clergy.

Rev. E. E. Styles read a paper on Pastoral Visitation. This also was fully discussed.

Another paper, on the preacher in his study, was read by Rev. J. B. Gough. This also received brief discussion.

All the papers were excellent and formed a most interesting and useful part of the proceedings.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded to the Cascumpeque friends for their kind and generous hospitality.

All the visitors expressed themselves with the renovation of the church. Both outside and inside, and especially inside, the church is a credit to the community.

In the evening a missionary meeting well attended and presided over by the Chairman, was held. Miss Mary Learl presided at the organ. Rev. F. A. Wightman gave a ray and instructive account of the West Indies where he had labored for twelve years as a Minister of the Western Church. Rev. Hugh Miller, who has spent some years in the ministry in Newfoundland gave an interesting account of the work there. It was an excellent meeting, greatly enjoyed by those present.

## CUBAN REVOLT WILL SOON END

HAVANA, Aug. 30.—Investigation shows that the statement made by Senator Dolz, a leader of the Democrat party, at the conclusion of a conference with President Palma at midnight, to the effect that practically all the insurgent leaders of consequence except Pino Guerra had signified their willingness to disband their men if all were guaranteed immunity, was an exaggeration, but the impression is general to-day that the insurgents, with the exception of Pino Guerra, will soon lay down their arms. In the meanwhile, it is asserted that all recruiting will cease. The pay of the artillerymen, and rural guards has been raised, the officers getting a twenty percent increase and the privates an increase of fifty percent.
