Recommend United Church Salary Boost

TORONTO, May 14 — (CP) — A minimum salary of \$2,100 plus a free furnished house was recommended today for United Church of Canada ministers. It was proposed that the minimum pay be raised to \$2,200 by 1950 and \$2,400 by 1951 — a proposal to be put before the General Council meeting in Vancouver next September. These suggestions were made by the executive of the General Council of the United Church, which decided to ask all conferences of the Church to take steps immediately to meet the proposed minimum.

shipping firms in Montreal have obtained permission from the Transport Department and from Canadian Vickers to visit the drydock and examine the Abegweit in detail. Representatives of construction firms which held contracts for work on the Prince Edward Island ferry were also on hand shortly after the ship's arrival and questioned Captain Murdoch and his engineers closely on the operation of the ship and behaviour of the equipment their own individual firms had supplied. So widespread is the interest to date in the Abegweit that Transport Minister Chevrier is considering a request from many Montreal sources that it be placed on display for a day or two at a central location in Montreal harbor for public inspection.

Eager For Details - The Department is still awaiting a detailed report from Canadian National Railways as operators of the vessel as to how it performed under difficult ice conditions. Engineers and designers both at Ottawa and Montreal are eager for details as to whether the forward propellers of the vessel acted as anticipated under actual heavy ice conditions and facilitated passage of the Abegweit through large stretches of ice. On this report may depend design of the ice-breaking features of the new Dominion Government vessel to replace the old "Nascope" which foundered last year off Hudson Strait in the eastern Arctic. If the Abegweit's forward propellers fulfilled the intent of the designers, it is probable that identical equipment will be installed on the new vessel for Arctic service.
