MRS. MATILDA FEEHAN

Once again the residents of Mount Stewart and vicinity were called upon to mourn the passing of another of its oldest and most respected citizens. This time every one was saddened to learn that the soul of Mrs. Matilda Feehan, a grand old lady of eighty-three years, had passed to her eternal reward on March 23rd. Born in Mount Stewart, the daughter of the late David Egan and Johanna McLaughlin, most of her girlhood was spent with her parents until in 1892 she became the wife of the late James W. Feehan of Savage Harbour where she lived the life of an exemplary Christian, an ideal housekeeper, and devoted wife and mother, and played a large part in making their home one of the most prosperous and up-to-date farm homes in the Province, and a byword for hospitality.

She leaves to mourn her passing two daughters, namely, Mrs. James Atkins of Glen Roy, and Mrs. Reginald Harold of New York. Also one son, Adrian D. Feehan of Mount Stewart, with whom she resided after the death of her husband, who predeceased her twenty-two years ago; one daughter, Aletha having passed away in 1913. She is survived also by three sisters, namely, Mrs. (Dr.) Walsh, Mount Stewart; Mrs. (Dr.) John C. McDonald, Mount Stewart, and Mrs. Ernie Douglas of Denver, Col., also three brothers, Victor Egan, of Cherry Hill; Joseph Egan of Boston, and Raymond Egan of Arizona.

Her funeral, under the direction of A. A. Hennessey, was held on March 26th from the home of her son, A. D. Feehan and was very largely attended. Services at the Church and grave were conducted by her pastor, Rev. T. Campbell, P.P.

The bus owned and operated by Eastern Coach Lines and driven by the popular and capable driver Sonny George, is once again in operation from Georgetown, renewing a greatly missed link in transportation to the city.

The C. G. S. Brant arrived in Georgetown on Wednesday from Pictou. She proceeded to take on the harbour and river buoys and on Thursday was engaged in placing them. The Harbor Master, Captain John Ferris supervised proceedings.

Mr. Leo Grant is visiting for a few days at the home of his father-in-law, Mr. John DeLory of Richmond Street and while here is renewing many old acquaintances. Mr. Grant is a member of the crew of the S. S. Saint Helena, which runs from Saint John, N. B. to Digby, N. S., and which is at present in dry dock undergoing her annual overhauling.

The school inoculating clinic took place in Georgetown High School on Wednesday. Dr. A. A. Kennedy, assisted by Public Health Nurse, Miss Mary Leslie, R. N., inoculated one hundred and seventy-five children from six months and over. The pupils of the three senior rooms were not inoculated on Wednesday due to the large number in the lower rooms and under school age attending. The second of three clinics will be held in four weeks time.

The seriousness of grass fires was forcibly demonstrated on Tuesday when the barn and out-buildings on Mr. Pius Steele's property at Lower Montague were burnt to the ground, after Mr. Steele had left home satisfied that a grass fire he had been tending was out. The same day at Southport Island a house owned by Mr. Fred Allen, now of Georgetown was burnt. This fire also apparently was the result of a grass fire, started in some unknown manner. The prompt action of two fishermen in stopping the flames from crossing a road, no doubt saved many fishermen's shanties, which were threatened.

Belgium's Coalition Cabinet Resigns

BRUSSELS, May 5—(Reuters)—Resignation of Premier Paul-Henri Spaak's Belgian coalition cabinet was accepted today by Prince Regent Charles who immediately asked that the Government stay on as caretakers. Circles close to the Premier said he decided to resign rather than face the possibility of an open split in his own Socialist Party 'force in the Government. The resignation followed the Socialist parliamentary group of a proposal, supported by the Premier, for greater subsidies to Catholic schools — a 75-year-old controversy in Belgian politics.

PARA-RESCUE UNIT STATIONED IN N.S.

MIDDLETON, N. S., May 6—(CP)—A para-rescue unit headed by LAC J. C. Courturier of Edmundston, N.B., is the latest addition to the R. C. A. F.'s search squadron at nearby Greenwood Airport.

The highly trained parachutists will descend from aircraft to aid injured or sick persons in remote areas where it is impossible to land a plane. They will keep in radio contact with their plane, which will drop any necessary supplies, provided by the safety equipment section, under the supervision of Flt. Sgt.
