K. of C. Wins Opener From S. & M. 10-5 For Junior Baseball Title

The Charlottetown Knights of Columbus Juniors showed superiority both at bat and field yesterday at the Summerside High School diamond to win the first game of the junior finals for the Prince Edward Island championship, defeating Summerside's Sheen & McInnis Juniors by the score of 10 to 5.

Both starting pitchers made way for relief hurlers in the ninth inning. Simmons with none out, and Burke with two away. Murphy, coming in from centrefield to relieve Burke with the bases loaded by reason of Burke's sudden lack of control made only one pitch. Simmons being caught and run down between third and home to end the game.

Charlie Ryan's smart southpaw, Burke, pitched winning ball until his temporary relapse into wildness in the final inning. He gave up only six hits and struck out twelve, and although he did give up eleven free passes to first he kept them pretty well scattered until the ninth frame. The visitors banged out twelve safe hits in all eleven off Simmons and one off Stewart. Simmons gave up five walks but two of these were intentional, Ready being allowed to walk to first in the eighth and ninth innings with Knights on second and third. The strategy worked both times, Hughes who followed Ready forcing Murphy at third in the eighth and grounding out to the pitcher in the ninth to retire the side on each occasion.

Murphy, Matheson and MacKenzie did the heavy sticking for the victors, getting 3 for 3, 3 for 4, and 4 for 3 respectively. Murphy hit a brace of doubles and Matheson one two-bagger. Benny Grady had a perfect day at bat for Summerside, hitting 3 for 3. Many scoring opportunities on both sides went by the board, the Knights leaving 12 runners stranded on the sacks and Sheen & McInnis, 18.

front at the half but as they hit the backstretch the trailing Sandy D. and Worthy Ermine paced into the picture. Sandy D. had the lead at the seven eighths; halfway down the stretch he was still in front but Worthy Ermine driven by "Ike" Moreside pacing a storm moved up foot by foot and at the wire was a head to the good. Filbert and Judd had a battle of their own for third with the latter getting the nod.

Second Heat: It was Worthy Ermine again for her second straight win. Filbert stole the rail going away to lead the field by the half and up to the three quarters pole but then Worthy Ermine started coming on. Driver Moreside had her up on even terms at the seven-eighths and then outpaced Filbert through the stretch to win by a length with Judd nipping Sandy D. for third place. The mid was in 2:08 3-5 a fifth of a second away from Worthy Ermine's record.

Third Heat: The free for all was reduced to Filbert and Sandy D. as both Worthy Ermine and Judd were drawn though lameness. Filbert went away on top and was never headed; Sandy made his bid from the top of the stretch but couldn't quite make the grade finishing a length back.

2:17-2:20 Pace (First Division)

First Dash: The upsets continued as Earl Semple took Jessica Direct from far back to head Billy McVey and Lock Hanover with a sensational burst of speed in the stretch. Lock Hanover and Prince Budlong raced all out to the quarter before Lock took over, they kept their positions to the backstretch. Billy McVey making the first move paced to the front at the top of the stretch and opened up a two length lead; he looked like a sure thing but Jessica, pacing like lightning headed the two lead horses to win in 2:08 4-5, a new record.

2:17-2:20 Pace (Second Division)

First Dash: Again the fans saw a giving finish as Len O'Meara took Quick Lick out in the stretch to head a closely-packed four-horse field. Colleen Adam went away on top and as they went up the backstretch the field strung out. They held their positions right around to the backstretch when all went to drives, Tennessee Sue

Quick Lick and Single Streak moving up very fast. They were all bunched halfway down but Quick Lick had just too much brush for them with Tennessee Sue beating Single Streak for the second spot. Second Dash: It was another blanket finish between four horses as Tennessee Sue, Ohio Hal, Quick Lick and Single Streak came like lightning from the seven-eighths pole after the leader Colleen Adam. They corralled her 50 yards from the wire and it was Quick Lick who had his nose in front with Single Streak second on the outside, Ohio Hal third, Tennessee Sue fourth, Colleen Adam fifth and Miss Knox sixth.
