FIVE-DAY WEEK NEXT OBJECTIVE

WASHINGTON, April 10 (U. P.)—Federal employes, who won a substantial victory recently with the passing of the law granting them an all-year-around Saturday half holiday, now are ready to move for a five-day week and reduction of the retirement age, it was disclosed at a banquet held by Federal employes Union No. 2.

The next legislative battle of Government workers will be on the issue of the five-day week. Henry G. Nolda, secretary-treasurer of the union, declared.

John S. Beach, chief of the retirement division of the Pension Office, and V. J. Biller, chairman of the committee on education and retirement of the union, urged the need for retirement at a younger age.

Biller said workers should be required after 30 year's service, regardless of age. Beach suggested the age limit be reduced to 60 for all classes of employes.

Further legislative reforms were urged by Joseph Stanfield, president of the union, who suggested establishment of a "Board of Civil Service Appeals" to which employes might carry complaints of "unfair" administration of compensation and efficiency ratings.

GERMAN WOMAN SEEN AS SUCCESSOR TO WILLS

LONDON, April 10 (U. P.)—Germany will probably produce the ultimate successor to Mrs. Helen Wills-Moody as world's lawn tennis star according to the beliefs of experts here.

The game among women in Germany has progressed steadily in the last five years and it is now generally admitted that Fraulein Cilly Aussem and Fraulein H. Krahwinkel are a distinct menace. Even "Big Bill" Tilden once told a well-known British critic that he believed Cilly Aussem would one day replace the famous Helen.

Despite her periods of bad luck, in the way of eye trouble and inactivity owing to her unfortunate accident at Wimbledon last year when she sprained both her ankles playing the semi-final against the Californian Elizabeth Ryan, the popular Cilly's record is good.

Some enthusiasts, however, prefer the chances of Fraulein Krahwinkel for the world crown. Her game is graceful and effective, but critics declare that she could improve considerably if she would take more frequent excursions to the net and develop the art of volleying.

HELENA, Mont., April 9.—Montana is a paradise for big game hunters, and one of every three persons who sought big game in Montana's national forests last season was successful. More than 7,850 big game animals were bagged by the 23,600 nimrods who scoured the hills. The 1930 bag included 2,000 elk, 5,000 deer, and 880 bear of which about 30 were silver tips. The animal census showed approximately 53,560 deer, 13,000 elk, 1,570 moose, 2,300 mountain goats, 6,200 mountain goats, 6,200 mountain sheep and about 8,400 bear of the black and 600 of the grizzly species.
