BRANCH LINE TO OPEN LINGAN BIG COAL SEAM

Seam Nine Feet Thick, Eight Miles Across Containing Eight Hundred Million Tons of Coal--Will Be Worked On Slope System Which Is Already Begun

SYDNEY, Oct. 14--(Special)--The Dominion Coal Co has let a contract for a branch railway from Grand Lake to Lingan.

The seam is nine feet thick and eight miles wide. It will be worked on the slope system several of which will be started. One was opened today.

A DIRIGIBLE AIRSHIP SAILS OVER LONDON

Journey from Farnborough, Thirty-Five Miles, and Manipulation Above the Crowded Streets Without Difficulty--Machine a Success

LONDON, Oct. 12--The dirigible was given several trials at Aldershot Camp, sailed from Farnborough thirty-five miles southwest of here, to London, and after manoeuvring over the city, started back to its headquarters.

When the Nulli Secundus made her notable trial trip, September 10, at Farnborough it was in charge of Col. Chappell, Capt. King, and P. S. Cady, an American.

YORK COUNTY LOAN COMPANY SHAREHOLDERS

May Have To Pay up All Arrears or Forfeit Claims to Assets

TORONTO, Oct. 14--(Special)--Shall 25,418 shareholders of the defunct York County Loan and Savings Co. pay account which were in arrears when the crash came?

The National Trust Co. liquidators, demand that they shall. In all 25,418 shareholders in this class have claims aggregating \$1,550,568. Their arrears can only be approximated. The sum from 25 cents to 25 dollars each, and possibly amount altogether to \$300,000.

If the referee decides in favor of the liquidator's contention all these dilatory shareholders will be asked to pay up or forfeit their rights to any share or dividend from the assets.

CITY COUNCIL HOLD REGULAR MEET LAST NIGHT

Nothing of Much Importance Before the Board--Dogs Will Have to Pay Tax--By-Law To Amend Rate of Truckage.

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held last night. His Worship Mayor Paton presided. There were present Councillors Hooper, Riley, Stewart, Reddin, McDermid and Roger.

After routine and passing of bills letters were read. Among these was one stating that the numbers for the city houses were being made and would be shipped as soon as possible. It is not likely that there will be much more delay.

TO SEND BACK HINDUS LANDED AT VANCOUVER

180 Asiatics Who Landed Without Enough Money to be Deported.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Oct. 14--Out of 515 Hindus arriving on the C. P. R. steamer Tartar today, the dominion immigration agent rejected 180, over one hundred not having sufficient money, and the rest were physically unfit. All will be deported. The balance made an unique procession in varied colors running like frightened sheep through the streets. None could speak English.

A letter was also read from Abram Henry stating that he had not resigned the position of engineer of the Market Building, and that he had merely been away on leave at the time a successor was appointed.

It was ordered that the City Surveyor have delivered to Bruce Stewart & Co. the old street roller which that firm has purchased from the City. The matter of the dog tax aroused some discussion--it was claimed that the dogs through the owners had not been paying taxes--and the opinion was expressed by Councillors Stewart that some dogs might be found in the City if a search were made for them.

Fanning Flame Of Discontent In Indian Empire

Keir Hardie is Accused of Causing Mischief in India--Demand His Expulsion--Say Labor Leader Should Not be Permitted to Preach.

LONDON, Oct. 9--The Indian discontent has been brought vividly within the ken of the British public. It was no little shock to the average Englishman to be told that the condition of Eastern Bengal under British rule was worse than that of Russia, and that the atrocities committed there would, if known in England, provoke more horror than did the Turkish massacres in Armenia. The Englishman rubbed his eyes and asked himself if he were dreaming. Then he saw that the author of the charges was James Keir Hardie. He knew Keir Hardie and did not attach any importance to what that ebullient labor leader said, and was at first inclined to dismiss the whole matter with good humored contempt. Then it was born in upon him that the natives of India did not know Keir Hardie and that the latter's statements of how he
