Recovery In West Making Good Progress

The economic co-operation administration, which supervises the application of the Marshall Plan in Europe, has just made a country-by-country report which serves to summarize recent indications that post-war recovery in the west is finally getting up a full head of steam.

The tone of the report is one of cautious optimism. In its hundreds of pages are listed both the achievements of a year of operation and the dangers still to be faced.

France's inflated money, Britain's dollar shortage, increasing unemployment in Belgium which for a time led all Europe in recovery, the damage to Europe of civil war in Indonesia, slowness in merging the Allied occupation zones in Germany—all of the drawbacks receive their share of emphasis.

So do the accomplishments—the British acceptance of and success with austerity; French and Italian laws designed to overcome their most glaring weaknesses; the jumping German production index, and the general improvement of living conditions.

The report is a convincing argument for the value of American aid to Europe and the need for its continuance.

It also indicates a strong and continuous effort by the administration to limit expenditures to the real necessities, to maintain a steady momentum but to cut when cutting is possible.

This is a vital factor, for the very size of the 14-volume report—with details on Denmark and Greece still to come—is a strong reminder of the magnitude of the effort and of its dangers.

The greatest of these dangers, of course, is the accompanying military effort—fundamentally wasteful of resources, however necessary.

If anything happens to the western economy or to American economy through these heavy expenditures, Russia will have accomplished a large part of her purposes.

Russia has always expected a breakdown of capitalist economy to open the way for Communist expansion throughout the world. Deliberately or not—many observers believe it is a specific policy—Russia's actions since the Second World War have placed a great strain on the Western economy.

situation which E.C.A. describes in Turkey, an example of this strain. Her "efforts to stand firm against threatened aggression" has caused heavy financial obligations with "serious impact" on the country's resources. Close to one half of the Turkish budget goes for defence. "The advancement of Turkish economic development, to provide a higher economic level of productivity with consequent benefits to Turkey, the United States and Western Europe, is hindered." If spending for peace is essential, careful balance is no less so. Otherwise the west could defeat itself in the cold war.
