S. Calvert, West Middlesex, and Chief Liberal Whip, in the House of Commons to the vacancy of the National Transcontinental Railway Commission, caused by the death of Robert Reid. MINUTES OF PRESBYTERY

At St John N. B. and within St David's Church there, on Wednesday, October 21, 1909, at 3.30 a. m., the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met at the call of the Moderator of the Synod, and was constituted by the Moderator pro tempore, Mr D. B. McLeod, with whom were present, Messrs. John Murray, R. P. Murray, T. F. Fullerton, R. G. Strathie, E. McDonald, A. Grey, W. I. Green, W. McLeod, John Hawley, John Sterling, A. Craze, M. H. McIntosh, A. D. Sterling, ministers; M. A. McNeill, A. S. Nicholson, James Moar, James G. McCallum, John McInnis, T. D. Ramsay, A. S. Gordon, Eben Campbell, Charles McNeill, elders. Presbytery accepted the resignation of Mr E. McDonald of the pastoral charge of Bloomfield, etc., to take effect on and after the tenth day of October instant, and expressed appreciation of Mr McDonald's faithful work in that large field. Mr J. H. McHattie was appointed interim moderator of Bloomfield session and instructed to have the charge declared vacant as soon as possible. The report of the P. E. Island Presbytery of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society was read. The report showed that \$1,583 had been contributed to foreign missions and \$57.59 to home missions during the year. The Presbytery received this report and commended the work done by the society.
Mr T. F. Fullerton reported that he moderated in a call at Georgetown on the 20th day of September last, that the call came out unanimously in favor of Mr H. W. Toombs of Upper Stewiacke, N. S., that it was signed by 54 members and 41 adherents, and accompanied with a guarantee of \$800 stipend in monthly payments, with use of manse. The conduct of the moderator was approved, the call sustained as a regular Gospel call, and the clerk was instructed to forward the same to the clerk of the Presbytery of Truro. Messrs. T. F. Fullerton and R. G. Strathie were appointed to represent the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island and the congregation calling before the Presbytery of Truro in prosecuting the call.
It was agreed, on motion, that the congregation of Georgetown be congratulated on their forward step in passing off the list of augmented charges and becoming self-sustaining. Provincial arrangements were made for inductions at Georgetown as follows: The moderator of Presbytery to preside and induct, Mr D. Wright, to preach, Mr M. N. McLeod to address the minister and Mr R. P. Murray 'the people. Date of the induction to be fixed by the moderator and clerk. Serving of the edict was left in the hands of the interim moderator of session.
Mr A. B. McLeod was appointed to address the minister at induction at Montague in place of Mr George McLennan, deceased.
It was moved, seconded and carried that application be made to the Home Mission Board for ten dollars for pulpit supply at Georgetown. Presbytery then adjourned to meet at the call of the moderator and clerk, of which public intimation was made, and this sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

VERDICT OF MANSLAUGHTER.

HALIFAX, Oct. 23—John Fraser, charged with the murder of Duncan Brown was yesterday found guilty of manslaughter at New Glasgow. Brown met his death in New Glasgow, June 8th. The prosecution had a strong case against the prisoner but could not show no motive for the awful deed.
The defence was able to prove that Fraser was not only under the influence of liquor at the time of the murder, but was also under the influence of morphine.
Fraser is charged with the murder of a young man, Duncan Brown, of New Glasgow on June 8th last. This afternoon was spent in taking the evidence of witnesses for the prosecution. It was but a repetition of that given at the preliminary examination of the accused and went to show that Fraser, Brown and others had been drinking in the alleyway near a stable when the shooting occurred. At five p. m. the Court adjourned. The Crown have still several witnesses to call tomorrow morning, but may not consider it necessary to call them, and the defence will likely begin tomorrow morning.
The cross examination of the witnesses today would indicate that the defence will endeavor to show that Fraser was under the influence of liquor and morphine when he shot Brown, and that he knew not what he was doing. He had no intent to kill, and should not be held guilty of murder, and that the charge should have been that of manslaughter. The Jury were detained in custody of a Constable as is customary in cases of this kind, and will have no intercourse with the public until the case is finished. Provision for their comfort has been made in or near the Court House. A. R. Munroe, of Westville, is the foreman.
