FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

(Received over Pittfield and Co's Private Wire)

TORONTO, Dec. 14—Eldorado Gold Mines—Current rumors regarding a pending increase in the price of uranium products are confirmed today by officials of Eldorado Gold Mines. It is stated today that the increase will come into effect at the first of the year and will amount to approximately 18 per cent. As a result of the increase, Eldorado automatically comes a large tonnage producer of uranium and since the relationship between the two is constant becomes dominant in world uranium markets to exactly the same degree that the Canadian manufacturer in radium—for each gram or twenty eighth of an ounce of radium uranium production runs between 7,500 and 8,000 pounds. In recent months there is reported to have been a brisk world demand for the material. In the U. S. marketing of Canadian uranium is handled by Dupont Nemours.

TORONTO, Dec. 14—Lapa Cadillac—The east drift on the 290 foot level is advancing in the c-2 ore body. Denison Denny, mine manager, reports. The first 22 feet of drifting in the Greywacke graded \$5.60 in back sampling and the next foot graded \$5.25 in the face sampling. This ore body was more than 150 feet long on the first level. The results now being obtained on the second level with widths up to 43 feet indicated are regarded by Mr. Denny as important.

St Anthony—Have extended record date for subscription for new stock. The shares will not sell ex-rights on the T. S. E. until further notice.

Barber Larder—According to the northern advisers close to the management Barber Larder has obtained impressive results in the last four holes. Details of drilling and an estimate of indicated ore tonnage is expected to be issued by officials early next week.

OTTAWA, Dec. 14—Canadian government has received a shipment of 18 Westland Wapiti fighting airplanes from Britain which were purchased for the purpose of intermediate training of members of the Royal Canadian Air Force. The ships are at present stored at the plant of the Ottawa Car Mfg. Co. where they are being inspected with a view to determining whether they need alterations.

TORONTO, Dec. 14—Perron—November production at a new high at \$108,569 compared with previous peak in October of \$100,202. Development on the 600 foot level is stated to indicate another important zone with all drifts in excellent ore.
