LAST WORDS OF GENERAL BOOTH.

(Canadian Press.) LONDON, Aug. 21—Almost the last words General Booth uttered, just before he lost consciousness, referring to God's promises and speaking with great difficulty, were: "I have no doubt, they are sure if you will only believe."

The announcement of his successor will probably be made in a day or two. The papers pay marked tribute to the dead leader. (Canadian Press.) NEW YORK, Aug. 21—Eva Booth, the General's daughter, is prostrated by the news of her father's death and may not be able to go to London for the funeral.

Bullington Booth, who became estranged from his father sixteen years ago and founded the Volunteers of America, has sent the following telegram to Branwell Booth: "Love and sympathy to father and yourself." Sgd. Bullington and Maud. (Canadian Press.) LONDON, Aug. 20—General Booth, Commander in Chief of the Salvation Army, died here tonight at 10.13 o'clock.

PRES. TAFT ASKS FOR CANAL EXPLANATION.

(Canadian Press.) WASHINGTON, Aug. 21—The Panama joint resolution was asked by President Taft yesterday, in a special meeting of Congress, to make clear the rights of foreign ship owners to carry into American ports. The question of free tolls in the Panama Canal was turned down late yesterday by the Senate committee on Inter-oceanic canals. By a vote of 8 to 6, the committee determined not to report on the resolution asked for by President Taft.

This is taken by leaders of the Senate to mean that there will be no resolution passed supplementary to the Panama Canal Bill which now lies on the President's table awaiting signature. The resolution has not yet been formally introduced in either house. The Senate committee took a direct vote on the proposal as embodied in the President's message.

RIGHT HON. R. L. BORDEN TO LEAVE FOR CANADA.

(Canadian Press.) LONDON, Aug. 21—The Right Hon. Robert L. Borden, Canadian Premier, who came to London last July to discuss Canada's naval policy and the Panama Canal question, will leave England for Canada on August 30th. The Premier does not expect anything will be done by the Canadian Government regarding the Panama Canal Bill until after his return to Ottawa and until after the measure has been finally ratified by American Congressmen.

HON. MR. HAZEN RETURNS HOME.

(Canadian Press.) LONDON, Aug. 21—Hon. Mr. Hazen sailed today for his home, accompanied by Rear Admiral Kingsmill. Mr. Hazen is gratified with the growth of the Imperial Federation of England and with the attitude of both parties in the British Parliament towards Imperial defeat. He believes the time is not far away when the Imperial representation of some parliamentary character will be granted the overseas dominions.

BRENNAN GIVES DETAILS OF GRAFT CHARGES

(Canadian Press.) DETROIT, Mich., Aug. 21—The testimony of W. K. Brennan, Burns' operative, was given at the police court examination today of Honest Tom Glinnan, first of eighteen Aldermen recently arrested on bribery charges to be tried in court. It was Brennan's evidence which resulted in the arrests of eighteen aldermen and common council clerk Edward Schreiter, the latter having since made a complete confession. Today Brennan went into all of the details of tapping of aldermen up to the time he alleges he was representing himself to be an official of the Wabash Railroad and paid Glinnan \$1,000 for influence in granting railroad's request for the use of city street for building purposes.
