ENGLAND WITHIN HER RIGHTS ADMITS PROF. MUNSTERBURG TO PRINCEPAL PETERSON

had given at the end of July definite secret promises for England's readiness to fight together with Russia. This might easily be made the subject of a question in the British Parliament, where no evasion or equivocation is permitted to the representatives of the nation. Such a question could be appropriately put, say, by Mr. Ramsay MacDonald, if indeed he has not done so already. As for Sir Edward Grey, whose word is accepted throughout the whole English-speaking world, both he and Mr. Asquith have categorically denied that there was any secret commitment that tied Britain in any way, till she declared war after the violation of Belgian neutrality. And the suggestion, or statement, quoted above is further negative by Edward Grey went the extreme length of offering to throw France and Russia over if they obstructed any reasonable peace proposals that Germany might put forward. (White Paper No. 111.)

"I quite agree with you that it is natural that in some of the official publications something may have been omitted which the other side would consider important, but I'm confident that 'whatever record leap to light' it will not take the shape of the discovery of any British intrigues. For the most interesting disclosure would be the nature of the communications which the German Emperor, and his associates, made in Vienna, and anything that would help me to understand what he can be intended that, while refusing a conference, he they 'labored sincerely to the end in the interests of peace.'

WHY DID GERMANY ACT?

"I do not know where the frontier incidents, to which you refer, took place. What I do know is that till war actually began the French Government kept its troops six miles from the frontier. And as to mobilization dates, I am sure that, except on some assumption—to see why Russian mobilization against Austria should have been interpreted and at once acted upon by Germany as a declaration of war against herself.

"As to England's neutrality, nothing but German reluctance to believe in the honor of the British Foreign Secretary can account for the view that England's attitude in this matter was in any way different in 1914 from what it was in 1870. It is on record in the White Paper that Sir Edward Grey asked the French Government 'Whether it was prepared to engage to respect the neutrality of Belgium so long as no other Power violated it.' The French Government replied that they were resolved to respect it. The assurance, it was added, had been given several times, and had formed the subject of conversation between President Poincaré and the King of the Belgians. If the German Chancellor had respected treaty obligations in 1914 as Bismarck did in 1870, and as the French had pledged themselves to do, Belgium would never have been touched.

"I very greatly regret for their own sakes, the unanimity with which German writers try to make out that England's only concern with Belgian neutrality proceeded from self-interest. Like the systematic attempts to defame and disparage Sir Edward Grey, this will recoil on their own heads, as it seems to point to fundamentally different conceptions, of national honor. Even apart from treaty obligations to a power which, if small, was still independent, even apart from her interest in preventing a (potential) hostile occupation of the Belgian littoral—there was for Britain the consideration that the neutrality which Germany has outraged constituted, and ought to have been allowed to remain, an effective barrier against just such a war as this. Europe had agreed to put, as it were, a fence round what in the past has been its 'backbitting' and would-be combatants would obviously be hampered in finding a fighting ground elsewhere. In this way Belgian neutrality has always been regarded as a peace-factor by peace-loving nations.

"If you tell me that Belgium and France agreed to act together in the event of aggression from Germany, I must be allowed to say that I do not wonder at it. Bernhardi is not the only German authority who showed us before hand exactly how it was to be done—how by a sudden and irresistible rush through Belgium, Germany was to 'square her account with France and crush her so completely that France could never again come across Germany's path.' It is not wonder, I repeat, that France and Belgium had arranged to act together. What I do wonder at is the naïveté with which Germany after trying, to do all that she had said in advance she intended to do and had made elaborate preparations to accomplish, turns round and seeks to put the blame on the other side. The stereotyped and oft-recurring phrase about the 'deliberate onslaught on Germany by the Powers of the Triple Entente' seems to me to have been invented for the purpose of concealing the fact that Germany has been caught in the act of putting into force her accepted and approved policy of getting in the first blow in a fight which she had decided was inevitable.

"But I must not take up any more of your time with this rejoinder. I am sincerely grateful to you for the trouble you have taken in reply to my inquiry. I am really greatly relieved to find that, even in a letter written under stress of work, you seem to have so little to controvert, or to add to, in the official statement which I took the liberty of forwarding for your consideration. And I am particularly gratified to hear that you dissociate yourself from the insensate hate of England which is being so sedulously propagated. Its only foundation is that England would not consent to play Germany's cruel game. She preferred instead, to bleed with Belgium and the rest of Europe.
