**Search Made For Missing Farm Hand**

TRURO, N. S. Nov. 4.—Mysterious disappearance of William Lennox, an Irishman employed on the farm of T. D. Mingo for seven years, remained unsolved tonight as Royal Canadian Mounted Police officers made every effort to locate the missing man.

The farm hand has not been seen since early last Thursday morning and his employer said he could offer no reason for the sudden disappearance.

The mystery recalled the disappearance of Aulden Graham, wealthy Belmont farmer who has never been reported since he vanished more than a year ago.

**Nash Motor Company Continue Business As Usual**

KENOSHA, Wis., Oct. 23.—Definite clarification of the position of the Nash Motors Company in its negotiations in connection with a possible merger is contained in a letter sent from here today over the signature of C. W. Nash, chairman of the board to his dealers and distributors throughout the United States and Canada.

The letter declares that, "regardless of anything that may take place later the Nash Motors Company will continue to do business at the old stand under the name of the Nash Motors Company headed by me (C. W. Nash) as chairman of the board" and adds that "the name of Nash will dominate any deal that might be consummated."

"You are our partners and it is our duty to keep you informed on matters of this kind," the letter reads referring to rumors "that the Nash Motors Company is merging with another company and that its activities will be removed from Wisconsin to Detroit."

"Therefore," the letter continues, "I wish to state that over a period of the past two months there has been some conversation and negotiations looking towards the taking over of the Kelvinator Company of Detroit by the Nash Motors Company through some manner of exchange of securities. The proposal has never reached a point so far where it has been thought of sufficient importance to call a meeting of the board of directors of the Nash Motors Company to pass upon the question, and, if passed upon favorably by the board, to be submitted to the stockholders."
