RAILS FOR P. E. I. RAILWAY.—A steamship is now loading a cargo of rails at New York for Charlottetown.

SYNOD DELEGATES.—The delegates to the Presbyterian Synod are expected to arrive in the city this afternoon by the SS. Northumberland from Pictou.

MORE GERMANS.—About eighty more German prisoners are expected to arrive on the island the last part of the week. They will be employed on work on the railway line west of Charlottetown. The Agricultural Hall in this city is now being fitted up as quarters for them.

IN MEMORIAM.—The Guardian has received a memorial card referring to the death of the late Charles Churchill Richard, President Minard's Liniment Co., Ltd., born at Yarmouth April 21, 1853 died at Yarmouth, September 18th 1918.

THE NORTHUMBERLAND.—The Northumberland did not make a crossing from Pictou to Charlottetown yesterday. She leaves Pictou today for Charlottetown on the arrival of noon train from Halifax. This will be her last trip on this route for the present and tomorrow she resumes running on the Summerside-Point du Chene route.

WAR WASP LOST.—The S. S. "War Wasp," the first steel steamer launched at the Scotia Shipyard, Trenton, N. S., ran foul of the Hun pirate some time ago and was sunk. The "War Wasp" went under on the second attack. The first time she was torpedoed she managed to make an English port. She was repaired and put back in the service. Some months after she was torpedoed a second time and sunk. The first attack was the day after last Christmas, the final one in February. The story was interestingly told in a recent issue of the New York Times, by a wandering American who had been a seaman on board the "War Wasp."
