Ickes Resigns As U. S. Interior Sec'y

P. E. I. Gets Meagre Share In Dominion Hospital Handouts

OTTAWA, Ont., Feb. 13 (Special) — Of a total of \$7,850,000 spent by the Federal Government on hospitals and hospital buildings for veterans of the present war, \$75,000 or a little more than one-tenth of one per cent was expended in Prince Edward Island, according to figures in the Public Accounts, issued this week by Auditor General Watson Sellar. The total in Prince Edward Island includes a grant of \$7,172.26 for examination and treatment of war veterans at the P. E. I. Provincial Sanatorium and the sum of \$1,156.65 as paid to Dr. R. F. Seaman of Charlottetown among amounts exceeding \$1,000 paid civilian doctors and dentists for special services.
